Introduction

The Cisco Edge & Fog Processing Module (EFM) creates a reliable data communications messaging system on top of your data networking infrastructure. Use this data delivery system to rapidly deploy applications where needed, including at the edge, in the fog, or in the datacenter.

The Cisco Edge and Fog Processing Module is an open platform that allows micro services or applications to be added by anyone. This provides unlimited capability and growth by adding software components that optimize the results of the application, system, or outcome.

Cisco EFM addresses the complexity of building an enterprise ready scalable data messaging system for one or many applications to reside upon. The EFM includes tools to manage the system, the EFM system administrator, and the EFM system monitor.

Features and Functions

The system's key capabilities include:

- A high-performance framework for edge and fog processing.
- Reusable micro services for collecting data from, and providing control over, devices and machines. Data is also processed before delivery to the destination.
- Options for reliable data transport through the system, including batch and real-time streaming options.
- Flexible mechanisms for integration with IT systems, reporting, and analytics.
- An architectural framework to extend fog processing to multiple tiers: east-west (fog to fog) and north-south (hierarchical processing leveraging network topology).
- Easy-to-use GUI tools to simplify development, deployment, and operation for all aspects of the system.
- A pervasive control paradigm and flow of information back to micro services, devices, and machines for management, control, optimization, and specific actions.
- A completely open and polyglot system, where third parties can provide devices, processing storage, software modules, analytics, applications, or any combination thereof.

This technology makes IoT approachable and leads to much faster industry IoT adoption.

The Cisco Edge and Fog Processing Module Components

Component	Description
EFM Message Broker (DART Broker)	A small footprint component working with other brokers to form a message bus. The EFM Message Broker provides reliable and flexible data delivery between devices and micro services. The sources can be devices such as sensors or other micro services. Consumers can be micro services or user applications.
EFM C++ Broker	A multi-threaded high-performance message broker with very low footprint in order to leverage the multi-core capability of different platforms.
EFM Data Flow Editor	Defines message paths between devices and micro services.
EFM Data Flow Engine	Executes message paths between devices and micro services. We recommend installing this adjacent to the EFM Message Broker to perform data transformation and input sources that are not in the canonical data format of the system.
EFM System Administrator	Configures and manages the message broker and micro services.
EFM System Monitor	A standalone tool for operators to obtain real-time functional status of a deployed solution.
Cisco ParStream (Historian database)	Purpose-built database to handle the massive volumes and high velocity of IoT data, as well as analytics at the Edge.
EFM Tools Runtime Engine	A standalone runtime tool for visualizing dashboards and driving EFM System Administrator, EFM Data Flow Engine, and EFM System Monitor.
Links	DQL System Dataflow ParStream JDBC Device Simulator Alarming
Smart License Agent Tool for Nodes	A client that allows system users to manage license registration for Node Product IDs.
Smart License Agent Tool for Devices	The Smart License Agent client that allows system users to manage license registration for Device Product IDs.
Asset Manager	Detects and manages devices throughout the EFM Messaging system.
User Management	The User management is a component that allows managing users, groups, permissions and roles for the EFM Web based components.
DGLux5	Data Visualization Tool

IOT-DSA Message Brokers differences

The Cisco Edge and Fog Processing Module allows for the installation of two distinct message brokers.

- IOT-DSA DART Message Broker - Supports message broker functions as well as web based UI projects that include the EFM System Administrator, EFM Data Flow Engine and EFM System Monitor.
- IOT-DSA C++ Message Broker - Supports message broker functions, but web based UI projects are not supported. For Dataflow editing to be performed on the dataflow link running with a C++ broker, a connection must be performed via an upstream or downstream dataflow editor that does support the UI interface (DART broker) and navigate the node tree until the dataflow link is found.

We need to define a specific IP address for the IOS interface to provide the application container with a static DHCP address and a forwarding rule for the EFM ports to the container
EFM/DGLux permission management does not allow permission group settings for nodes "/downstream", "/sys" and any node below "/sys".	Use corresponding defaultPermission settings instead.
If the "default" permissions are specified onto a data node, eg. /data/au, it may override the actual default permissions as set in the server.json configuration.	When assigning permissions to a data node, eg. /data/au, ensure that you do <i>_not_</i> specify the "default" group within these nodes.
If permission management is deactivated by configuration file and a first permission group is created in System Administrator, the UI will not run properly until broker is restarted. Known Limitations

Default systemd script for ParStream does not include LimitNOFILE configuration. The global defined settings are ignored by systemd scripts.	Add this line to the service section of your systemd script for ParStream: <code>LimitNOFILE=131072</code>
Sometimes a dataflow will not be displayed correctly on a downstream C++ Broker (i.e. some elements might be missing).	In most cases opening the dataflow in the left section of the Dataflow Editor by clicking on the black triangle to see the embedded elements triggers the display of all elements. In most other cases, refreshing the browser will remove display problems.

Known Limitations

Component	Limitation
Dataflow Editor / DGLux: Stopwatch	Timer can delay code execution due to other browser tasks and system load.
C++ Broker / C Broker	The C++ Broker cannot establish https connections to the C Broker, as the C Brokers https server implementation is broken. Http connections work as expected.
EFM Manager	EFM Manager does not support discovery definitions with dimensions that use relative paths that resolve to the root node.

Best Practices

- When using Java DSLinks one should tune the Java Virtual Machine (JVM) to correspond to the memory and performance needs of the respective application. This includes (among others) tuning of “Garbage Collection”. An in-depth description about tuning the JVM can be found here:

- If upgrading a system of more than one EFM node, it is highly recommended that all the components be upgraded on all the platforms for consistent functionality. See the installation guide for installing or upgrading on each platform.

What is new in Release 1.0.1

- EFF System Administrator, for the Broker/Life Cycle Management “Update Server” has been fixed
- EFF System Administrator, System Administrator buttons “update all components” result in unsupported dart broker version update. The following actions have been removed:
 - Tab “Life Cycle”, Button “Update All Components” - removed
 - Tab “Job”, Action “Update All Components” - removed
 - Tab “Job”, Action “Update Server”, Dropdown List Entry “from Repository” - removed
- EFF ParStream Link 2.4 now uses an adapted ETL statement to decrease the amount of partitions, the corresponding modulo value can be configured in the System Administrator
- EFF Dataflow Editor - Fixes autosave feature.
- EFF Dataflow Editor - Fixes changing a block name when double-clicking in Chrome
- EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), Fixed memory leaks and memory access errors at startup
- EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), Fixed broker crashing when connecting with a link
- EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), installing an invalid Link no longer blocks installing or removing links
- EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), Fixed that C-Broker did not handle errno and return codes in the right fashion for upstream connections
- EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), Fixed that C-Broker tried to send message to closed link stream
- EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), removed IOx eff package for IR809/829 without Java
- EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), updated IOx eff package now properly supports serial port resources

Open Source Links:

- EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), Java Links did not start due to shell incompatibility. Update to a newer gradle version fixed this.

What is new in Release 1.1.0

New Features

- EFF DART Message Broker, DSLink support for IPV6
- EFF ParStream, ParStream support for IPv4 or IPv4 and IPv6 environments
- EFF ParStream, added new functionality for partition deletion
- EFF ParStream Link, added deletion mechanisms for historian tables

Incompatible Changes

- QoS levels changes to the following new definitions:

QoS Level	Definition
0	Default. Broker only sends the last value available from the publisher, no messages are stored except that one.
1	Non-durable queue. Broker maintains a queue with messages and sends as many as possible when there is enough bandwidth and processing power. Will drop messages when there is not or when client is disconnected.
2	Durable queue. Broker maintains a queue and stores messages even when client is disconnected. There should be no message loss when queue size is large enough.
3	Durable, Persistent queue. Broker queues and persists message on behalf of slow or disconnected requester.

QoS level support is different for the DART broker and C broker, the DART broker supports 0 through 3 and C broker support 0 through 2.

When upgrading an existing EFF (1.0 .0, 1.0.1, 1.1.0) installation to EFF 1.2.0, please make sure that you compile your existing links with the latest version of the respective SDK. This assures, that Brokers and Links use the same QoS semantics due to changes.

Bug Fixes and Improvements

- EFF DART Message Broker, DSLink support for IPV6 is enabled via server.json configuration option enableIPv6 set to true. When enabled, the server is listening on IPv6 interface only. To support a mixed IPv4 and IPv6 environment, two copies of a message broker need to be installed and configured.
- EFF System Administrator, fixed to "add new group" under Permissions tab. The new group currently requires a broker restart for use.
- EFF System Administrator, fixed browser issue on " add new group" action if language is not EN-US

- EFF System Administrator, partially fixed update link from zip. Pending fix to link version update without broker restart
 - EFF System Administrator, fixed authorizing quarantined connections in the Permissions tab
 - EFF System Administrator, all lifecycle management actions for IOx C Brokers appear in the Management tab
 - EFF System Administrator, fixed parsing of IPv6 addressing connection URL that caused a crash when restarting broker
 - EFF System Monitor, fixed improper graphing of Broker Details/Live Trend initial graph state
 - EFF Dataflow Editor, fixed recreating Dataflow Folder with identical name that was deleted
 - EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), Links are now installed in the data partition instead of the root partition of the container
 - EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), IOx default filesystem sizes have been expanded to the following values: 256 MB data partition size and 64 MB extra space in rootfs size (required for tmp files system operations including link upload)
 - EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), Lifecycle management no longer functions as a separate dslink and the functionality placed inside the message broker is placed under the /sys node, providing consistency with DART message broker. Actions will require a new reference to the node location. Quarantine functionality is non-functional in C-broker.
 - EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), Update from DART VM version 1.17.1 to 1.21.1 to increase stability of dslinks
 - EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), fixed QoS level 2 to adhere to new definition
 - EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), fixed C-Broker to catch up with messages
 - EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), Logging level expanded from a single level to support the configurable values none, fatal, error, warn, info, debug (available only in debug builds)
 - EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), Logging level is configurable at runtime
 - EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), fixed error that C-Broker sometimes did not reconnect to upstream connection
 - EFF C Message Broker (on IOx), all Java links properly start
 - EFF ParStream Link, ParStream password no longer visible in metrics pane
 - EFF Installer, fixed installer failure if installation path contains spaces

What is new in Release 1.2.0

Name changed from Edge and Fog Fabric to Kinetic Edge and Fog Processing Module.

New Features

- DGLux5 development tool is now available using the EFM core broker on Windows and Linux (installer option “dglux”). The user can request a 6 month 1500 topics trial license.
- EFM C Message Broker with Lifecycle Management is now available on Linux (installer option “cbroker”).

Bug Fixes and Improvements

What is new in Release 1.2.1

Configuration Change

- Starting with EFM 1.2.1 permission management is enabled per default for new EFM and DGLux Server installations.

Note: On an upgrade the existing configuration is not changed. To enable permission management the corresponding server.json file needs to be adapted entering non-null value for “defaultPermission”.

The recommend defaultPermission setting is:

```
"defaultPermission": [  
  [":config", "config"],  
  [":write", "write"],  
  [":read", "read"],  
  [":user", "read"],  
  [":trustedLink", "config"],  
  ["default", "none"]

```

When activating permission management and setting ["default", "none"] you should ensure the following additional adaptations have taken place in your setup:

- Upstream connections now must be configured with a permission group. For this you can add one of the defaultPermission groups “:config”, “:write” or “:read” to your upstream configuration.

- The default group “:user” defines the permission level for all EFM UI users which are not configured as superuser. The EFM GUI Admin User defined on installation (default: efmAdmin) is a superuser and therefore has “config” permissions.
- The default group “:trustedLink” defines the permission level for all DSLinks installed with your EFM server. You might reduce this to a lower permission level depending on your usage scenario.
- External DSLinks connecting to the broker must provide a token defining the permission level.
- For improved memory handling Cisco ParStream 5.2.0 now uses tcmalloc. If not already installed in your environment, you can install the depended library with the following commands.

On Ubuntu16.04 and Debian8:

```
apt-get install libtcmalloc-minimal4
```

On CentOS7:

```
yum install gperftools-libs
```

- Asset Manager, new component to detect and manage assets throughout the EFM message system (see Asset Manager User Guide)
- EFM Configurator, new tool to extract, adapt and deploy configurations from one IOx reference installation to multiple IOx targets (see IOx Application Configuration Guide)

- Cisco ParStream, failover enhancements: added scripts to start and shut down Cisco ParStream using common operation system functions (see Cisco ParStream Manual 5.3.0)

What is new in Release 1.5.2

New Features (beta version, not production ready)

- Cisco ParStream, added option “*ignoreBrokenPartitions*” for single node clusters to recover from power outages (default: false; feature inactive).
- Cisco ParStream, added option “*validatePartitions*” to detect broken partitions resulting from power outages during start up. This might slow down the node start up (default: false; feature inactive).
- Cisco ParStream, added option “*synchronizeFilesystemWrites*” to prevent data loss during power outages for merges and partition transfers (default: false; feature inactive).
- Enabling this option will slow down the operation of the database. This feature should only be activated if the system where the database is running on has no emergency protection like an uninterruptible power supply (UPS) and no clean shutdown of the operating system can be guaranteed.

Bug Fixes and Improvements

- ParStream Link, added action “*editDb*” to adapt existing database connections (see Cisco ParStream DSA Link Manual 4.1.2).
- ParStream Link, added recommended garbage collection parameters to start script.
- ParStream Link does now start on RHEL7.4 too.
- ParStream Link, fixed quoting error which prevented link to start on Windows in case of whitespaces in Java installation path.
- Cisco ParStream, fixed bug that prevented usage of *percentile_disc* in *CREATE JOB* statements.
- EFM Installer, upgraded Go version to prevent security vulnerabilities in go get implementation (CSCvk16152, CSCvk16153, CSCvk16154, CSCvk16156).
- EFM Installer, fixed timeout problem on EFM Admin User creation.
- Tools, added IIS Group Mapping Plugin to EFM package.
- Tools, IOx Application Configurator now continues in case of an error and writes a config.json.retry file which only contains the list of targets to retry.
- C Broker, fixed crash on DSLink disconnect.
- System Administrator, fixed bug in upstream connection creation.
- Dataflow Editor, fixed missing input property for importDataflow action.
- EFM and DGLux Server permission management, fixed bug that applied read permissions in case of trying to apply permissions to /sys node.
- System Administrator, removed permission group configuration for /sys and /downstream node as these will not work by design of permission management.
- System Administrator, fixed bug in permission management which cleared dropdown menu items if these left the visible window section (e.g. due to scrolling or toggling).

What is new in Release 1.6.0

Configuration Change

- Platform Support and Deployment:
 - On Ubuntu16.04 EFM only supports the new C++ Broker, no other components are supported on Ubuntu. It is necessary that the user migrate to RHEL7 or CentOS7 for EFM 1.6.
 - Installation on CentOS7 and RHEL7 EFM is performed using RPMs, the EFM Linux installer is no longer supported. All EFM components are now installed to a fix path under `/opt/cisco/kinetic`, system services are automatically created (for further details and migration instructions see EFM Installation Guide for Linux).
 - No default UI user is created during installation of DGLux server (see EFM Installation Guide for instructions how to add user).
- The C Broker will be replaced by a new C++ Broker. Generally, the C++ Broker is compatible with the C Broker configurations. The C++ Broker will be installed under `/opt/cisco/kinetic/cpp_broker`. It will create a default `broker.json` configuration file on first start.
 - The C++ Broker enforces https by default. During the installation, a self-signed certificate will be generated and installed. This certificate should not be used in production! You will need to add your own certificates to the C++ Broker for production use.
 - You will need to enable self-signed certificates (`self_signed_tls_certificate_allowed` in the `ssl` section) in the `broker.json` configuration if you use self-signed certificates for broker upstream connections.
 - The C++ Broker disables http connections by default. You will need to enable `http` in the `broker.json` configuration if http is required.
 - The C++ Broker does not support HTTP public key pinning.
 - The `data.json` format is not compatible to the C Broker `data.json`. The C++ Broker will migrate the `data.json` file automatically. Afterwards, it should not be used anymore with a C Broker. The C++ Broker will make a backup of the `data.json` file before merging it. It will be called `data.json.bak`.
 - C Broker QoS level 3 persisted subscription value queue files will not be migrated. You should first empty the queues before installing a C++ Broker.
 - The C++ Broker currently does not have a `/sys/query` action.
 - The lifecycle manager property `ssl_verify_peer` default has changed to `true`.
- Cisco ParStream, parsing column definitions of CREATE TABLE statements requires comma separation.
- ParStream Link, action `editDb`: parameters `host` and `port` have been removed. These connection parameters can now be edited using the actions of the new Cluster node and its children.
- ParStream Link, actions `addDb` and `editDb` now have a new parameter `useSSL` to enable/disable SSL encryption.

What is new in Release 1.6.0

- EFM Server, added new parameter "strictTls" to enable strict SSL certificate validation (default: false). If "strictTls" is enabled and self-signed certificates are used, the connection will be rejected.
- Java SDK, queue size for QoS levels 1-3 is now configurable. Default value changed from 1000 to 1024.

New Features

- Deployment: RPMs delivered for CentOS7 and RHEL7. All EFM components are now delivered as RPM files. Required system users are automatically created. Additionally, systemd services are automatically created which can be used to start the relevant processes and to configure the setup for automatic start on server start (for further details and instructions how to migrate from an installer-based setup to an RPM based setup see EFM Installation Guide for Linux).
- Platform Support: EFM does now support IC3K (for further details see EFM Installation Guide for IOx).
- Cisco ParStream, change dependency from system OpenSSL library to packaged CiscoSSL library.
- Cisco ParStream, added TLS encryption support for client and inter-cluster connections.
- ParStream Database, fixed parser to now reject invalid create table statements without separating commas between column definitions.
- Cisco ParStream, added Stored Procedures with CREATE PROCEDURE, CALL and DROP PROCEDURE (for further details see ParStream Manual section 9.4.1).
- ParStream Link, enabled TLS encryption (configurable by parameter useSSL in actions addDb and editDb).
- ParStream Link, added functionality to define alternative hosts for automatic re-connection in case of connection loss.
- New C++ Broker which replaces C Broker (further information to be found in EFM Installation Guides for Linux and IOx)
 - The C++ Broker is a multi-threaded high-performance broker with very low footprint in order to leverage the multi-core capability of different platforms. This allows allow for performance on the edge. The C++ broker scales and performs so well that we recommend to use it on all other levels, except when UI is required, in a multi-tier architecture.
 - The lifecycle manager has a new option `link_repository_url` for the `manager.json` configuration file. You can set the url for the link repository file. The default is `https://dsa.s3.amazonaws.com/links/links.json`. The address schema must be `https`.
 - The lifecycle manager has a new option `ca_file` for better ssl verification configuration.
- EFM Authentication, unified login (Single Sign-on) between Asset Manager, System Administrator, System Monitor and Dataflow Editor (for further details see EFM Installation Guide for Linux), unified landing page for all UI components. Note, Single Sign-on is not supported on Windows with EFM UI components.
- Asset Link, added synchronization between Asset Manager and DSLink

- Asset Link, added grouping on Asset Link
- Asset Manager, added schema migration tool to handle updates/new versions of Asset Schema Definitions
- EFM Server, Java SDK, Dart SDK: QoS levels are now fully aligned for all supported SDKs and Brokers (according to definitions introduced with EFM 1.0.1)

- EFM Server, proxy server password is now stored encrypted
- EFM Server, certificate password is now stored encrypted
- EFM Server, QoS bug fixes especially according to correct QoS propagation

What is new in Release 1.7.0

Configuration Changes
