If you're loading the Cisco IOS® Software Documentation CD on a Microsoft Windows 2000 machine, and you are using a CD produced prior to July 2000, the documentation files may not load properly. This document provides a workaround for the Windows 2000 users.

To Load the IOS Documentation CD on a Windows 2000 Machine

Follow the instructions provided below:

1. Uninstall any previously installed IOS Documentation files.
2. In Start --> Run, type **regedit** and press Enter.
3. Locate the following key:

HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE/SOFTWARE/Microsoft/IE4/Setup/Path.

4. Change the value from "%programfiles%\Internet Explorer" to the location where Microsoft Internet Explorer is installed on your computer, for example "C:\Program Files\Internet Explorer". Close the

regedit window.
5. Install the IOS Documentation CD.
