[The Delaunay](#) – *European Cuisine*

The Delaunay's two Private Dining Rooms seat up to 8 and 14 guests respectively and are available to book for breakfast, lunch and dinner. The two rooms can also be opened up to accommodate a long table of 24 guests. Located on a raised level above the ground floor of the restaurant, both rooms are discreetly shielded from the outside world yet flooded with light from large windows during the day. Clad in beautiful wood panelling and featuring original paintings from the restaurant's outstanding collection, the rooms are perfect for celebratory meals, as well as business gatherings, with a plasma screen available in the Kean Room.

Balthazar London is located on the corner of Russell Street and Wellington Street in the heart of Covent Garden. The restaurant offers all-day brasserie dining and is open for breakfast, lunch, afternoon tea and dinner, as well as an amazing weekend brunch. The French inspired menu includes fruits de mer from the raw bar as well as a wide selection of classical French brasserie and bistro dishes.

All the elements that have made the Hawksmoor restaurants famous are present at their Covent Garden steakhouse and cocktail bar.

This sexy, subterranean space has a playful and meticulously researched list of classic cocktails and perhaps the most carefully sourced, perfectly-cooked meat you'll ever eat.

Located in the old Watney-Combe brewery, Hawksmoor is best known for its peerless steaks, but the legendary Third Burger which changes regularly and is available from the bar menu often proves just as popular, as does the set lunch and pre & post theatre menu.

Even the side dishes – beef dripping potatoes, triple cooked chips, macaroni cheese and creamed spinach – are worthy of a visit in their own right.

The Ivy Market Grill recently opened at the end of November 2014, an all-day café and restaurant. Spread over the two floors, exclusively designed by Martin Brudnizki, he has given a nod to the late 19th century industrial age with an air of faded grandeur illustrated in the mosaic floor tiles, antique brass chandeliers and marble table tops. The Ivy Market Grill is a home from home, where fans of The Ivy, WC2 residents and visitors to the area can drop in for good food, delicious cocktails and a smidgen of that Ivy magic.

The Private Room at The Ivy Market Grill, on Henrietta Street in the heart of Covent Garden, is an intimate room situated on the lower ground floor of the restaurant.

The Private Room can accommodate up to 22 on one long table or up to 40 guests over four round tables of 10.

Comprising of three newly refurbished spaces (re-opened in May 2013) that recall the heady-glamour of the Modern American era, Christopher's brings you a Martini Bar on the ground floor, an elegant Dining Room on the first floor and a secluded Club Room on the lower ground floor for private events. Housed in a Grade II listed building with an interesting past of its own, including a period as a papier mâché factory and opening in 1870 as London's first licensed casino, Christopher's strives to bring you its own glamorous drinking and dining experience.

Choose from arrays of fresh and smoked fish, oysters, caviar and fresh seafood: delicious slivers of smoked salmon, cured sea bass or fresh rock oysters followed by Dover sole, lobster or sea bream; spatchcock, lamb cutlets or beef. Conclude with clever twists on classic desserts or the finest artisan cheeses

The restaurant's specialty aged Scottish beef and other roasts are carved at guests' tables – from antique silver-domed trolley, by Simpson's Master Carvers in a perfect example of restaurant theatre. Simpson's also serves the Great British Breakfast on weekdays, with the 'Ten Deadly Sins' for hearty appetites.

[Gordon Ramsey, Savoy Grill](#) - *British*

Savoy Grill is without doubt one of London's most legendary restaurants. Frequented by celebrated diners such as Sir Winston Churchill, Oscar Wilde, Frank Sinatra and HM Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother, the original seating plan has been brought back for its reopening.

Designer Russell Sage took inspiration from the restaurant's heyday, and original 1920's Art Deco features have been restored. Head Chef Andy Cook oversees a menu that returns to the classic Escoffier-inspired grill rooms of old. Dishes include charcoal grilled Chateaubriand with pommes soufflés, king crab and prawn cocktail, lime and chocolate soufflé and iced Peach Melba.

A private dining room is available for up to 40 guests and the restaurant also features a signature Chef's Table located in the heart of the kitchen, which can accommodate up to 8 people.
