# Labeled and Unlabeled Together on one BGP Neighbor on IOS-XR

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This document describes the behavior of receiving and advertising unlabeled and labeled paths over one BGP session in Cisco  $IOS^{\ensuremath{\mathbb{R}}}$  XR.

## Prerequisites

### Requirements

There are no specific requirements for this document.

### **Components Used**

This document is specific to Cisco IOS<sup>®</sup> XR, but it is not restricted to a specific software release or hardware.

The information in this document was created from the devices in a specific lab environment. All of the devices used in this document started with a cleared (default) configuration. If your network is live, make sure that you understand the potential impact of any command.

## Introduction

Address Family Identifier (AFI) is an indication of the kind of BGP route. Examples are 1 for IPv4 and 2 for IPv6.

Subsequent Address Family Identifier (SAFI) is a further indication of the kind of route. Example are 1 for an unlabeled route and 4 for a labeled route.

Unlabeled unicast for IPv4 is AFI 1 and SAFI 1.

Labeled unicast for IPv4 is AFI 1 and SAFI 4.

Unlabeled unicast for IPv6 is AFI 2 and SAFI 1.

Labeled unicast for IPv6 is AFI 2 and SAFI 4.

Labeled unicast (LU) is often referred to as RFC 3107 "Carrying Label Information in BGP-4."

Hereafter, U refers to unlabeled unicast, so SAFI 1 and LU refers to labeled unicast, so SAFI 4.

Note that Cisco IOS<sup>®</sup> XR needs "allocate-label all| route-policy …" or the route will not be originated or propagated to the next BGP speaker as SAFI 4.

IPv4/v6 unicast and labeled-unicast both on one BGP session was not supported on Cisco  $\text{IOS}^{\textcircled{R}}$  XR .

On Cisco IOS<sup>®</sup> XR, the support to have both unlabeled and labeled on one BGP session was done in 6.2.1.

# When running both on one session is not supported, it is problematic as the last received update/withdraw overrides the previous one, even if they were received on another SAFI.

When you configure both SAFI 1 and 4 on the same BGP session on a router running IOS-XR code prior to IOS-XR 6.2.1, the router gives the following warning:

bgp[1051]: %ROUTING-BGP-4-INCOMPATIBLE\_AFI : IPv4 Unicast and IPv4 Labeled-unicast Address families together are not supported under the same neighbor.
This warning message was introduced in IOS-XR 5.3.0 and IOS-XR 5.2.2.

## **Capability Exchange**

The capabilities exchanged between BGP peers must match. If not, the BGP session does not come up.

This is a wireshark capture of the capability exchanged for AFI 1/SAFI 1 and AFI 1/SAFI 4 in the BGP Open message:

Here's an example for IOS-XR configured with LU only on a session to IOS configured with U only.

The IOS router prints a syslog message for this configuration mistake:

## **IOS-XR Implementation Specifics**

## **Configuring U or LU**

You configure "address-family ipv4 unicast" under the BGP neighbor command to enable ipv4 unicast for the BGP session.

You configure "address-family ipv6 unicast" under the BGP neighbor command to enable ipv6 unicast for the BGP session.

You configure "address-family ipv4 labeled-unicast" under the BGP neighbor command to enable ipv4 labeled unicast for the BGP session.

You configure "address-family ipv6 labeled-unicast" under the BGP neighbor command to enable ipv6 labeled unicast for the BGP session.

In IOS-XR the AFI/SAFI combination is configured per BGP peer.

This is an example for a BGP session having both SAFI 1 and 4:

Notice that there is still only the "address family unicast" and not "address-family labeled-unicast" under router BGP. Both SAFI 1 and 4 paths are stored in this one BGP table.

### **BGP** Table

Regardless if IOS-XR is older or newer than 6.2.1, there is only one BGP table to store the U and LU routes. This is evident by the fact that you can only configure (enable) "address-family ipv4 unicast" or "address-family ipv6 unicast" under router bgp. You cannot configure "address-family ipv4 labeled-unicast" or "address-family ipv6 labeled-unicast" under router bgp.

The U and LU path can be identical. Before IOS-XR 6.2.1, receiving the same path again but this time with or without a label, would override the previously received path. After IOS-XR 6.2.1, the two identical paths will seen as different if they only differ by the label. The path additions,

deletions, or modifications are performed by the different SAFIs.

Here is an example of a route in the BGP table with AFI 1/SAFI 4. Because label allocation is enabled for all prefixes, this path will be stored with a local label. Because there is only one BGP table to store U and LU routes, the prefix shows up with both the commands "show bgp ipv4 unicast" and "show bgp ipv4 labeled-unicast"!

Notice that the path is marked with "labeled-unicast".

Notice that the path is marked with "labeled-unicast".

If the path is present as both U and LU, then the local Path ID is different.

### **Enabling the Local Label Allocation**

You must configure the command "allocate-label" in order for the received or sourced paths in BGP to have a local MPLS label. Without this command, the routes will not have a local label.

## **New Implementation on IOS-XR**

In the old implementation on IOS-XR, a warning is given when configuring both the U and LU on the same BGP session. The warning is introduced in IOS-XR releases 5.3.0, and 5.2.2. The warning is removed in IOS-XR release 6.2.1, because labeled and unlabeled are supported on the same BGP session.

This message indicates that the user has configured both IPv4 Unicast and IPv4 Labeled-unicast or IPv6 Unicast and IPv6 Labeled-unicast address families together under the same neighbor. This particular configuration is not supported.

Recommended action: Configure two neighbor sessions to the router. Configure the unicast address-family under the first neighbor session and configure the labeled-unicast address-family under the second neighbor session.

Configuration example for two BGP sessions between a pair of IOS-XR routers. Use a different (loopback) address for each BGP session.

In IOS-XR 6.2.1, both U and LU are supported on the same BGP session on the default VRF!

It does not matter if the BGP session is internal or external BGP.

U and LU on the same session is not supported for BGP speakers in any non-default VRF.

### **Update-groups**

Before IOS-XR 6.2.1, all U, LU, and U + LU BGP speakers were kept in separate update groups. After IOS-XR release 6.2.1, this is no longer true. Some BGP speakers in one update group can be only U, or only LU, or both U and LU.

### **Route Propagation**

The following table shows the advertisement and withdraw behavior for different scenarios. There are 16 scenarios.

All applies to IOS-XR version 6.2.1 and later, unless otherwise mentioned in the comments column.

Table 1 Advertisement behavior for iBGP and eBGP Sessions

NHS = Next Hop Self

NHU = Next Hop Unchanged.

If NHU is in effect, this means that next-hop self is not configured for an iBGP session.

Note that NHS is always the case when the BGP speaker sends to an eBGP peer.

There can be NHS or NHU towards an iBGP speaker, depending on the configuration of next-hopself. The default behavior towards iBGP peers is NHU.

For the second column: note that the path is considered to be unlabeled or labeled only if the bestpath or one of the paths marked with add-path is unlabeled or labeled.

For the route propagation it matters what characteristics the best path has. Depending on the characteristics (colums 2 to 4), it determines if the path is advertised as U, or LU, or both.

If the feature Additional Paths (ADD-PATH) is enabled and a path is marked with "add-path", the characteristics of that path also play a role how that path will be advertised.

"Local Label Present?: No" means the following: it is possible that a label is received with the received update, but the label is not installed. The local label is not installed if the command "allocate-label" is not there.

You can verify if the local label is present by looking at the prefix in detail. Use "show bgp <prefix> detail" or "show route <prefix> detail".

In the following example, the prefix is received without a label (so over a SAFI 1 peering) and no local label is assigned:

#### Allocating a Local Label

#### Allocate Label for Unlabeled Paths

By default, unlabeled paths (SAFI 1) are never labeled, even when the "allocate-label" command is configured.

As of IOS-XR release 6.5.1., there is the keyword "unlabeled-path" for the "allocate-label" command, so that also the unlabeled paths can be allocated a label.

The path is a SAFI 1 path, so there is no received label.

Because of the "unlabeled-path" command there is now a local label.

This will allow the cases 1 to 4 in table 1.

To figure out why a local label is still assigned when the "allocate-label" command is removed, run the debug "debug bgp label".

Here's an example:

You can see that this router received a label for the prefix 10.100.1.1/32, is an ASBR, is not an RR, and has next-hop-self for at least one BGP session. This results in this prefix needing a local label.

The local label remains:

If the prefix is in the LFIB depends if the prefix was received labeled or not and if allocate-label applies to that prefix.

Even if the BGP prefix is received over an LU session, but no local label is assigned, then the route is not advertised over another LU session were NHS is done. This is case 14 in table 1. This is the case if the outgoing BGP session is eBGP.

This is likely caused by not having the command "allocate-label" for address-family unicast under router BGP.

# You will need to restart the process BGP when removing the "allocate-label" command in order for the router to remove the local labels for the BGP routes.

The new advertise local-labeled-route command in table 1 is a new command to indicate that a route with local label should not be advertised as an unlabeled route via SAFI-1.

This command is the following:

#### advertise local-labeled-route [disable]

This command is configured under the neighbor address-family. The function of this command is to indicate whether an IPv4/v6 route with a local label should be advertised or not to the BGP neighbor via IPv4/v6 unicast (SAFI 1).

The default behavior is to advertise routes with a local label.

The new command could also be configured as:

#### advertise local-labeled-route safi-unicast [disable]

This command is configured under the af-group of the BGP section. Its function is the same as the one above and applies to all BGP neighbors.

The default behavior is to advertise routes with a local label.

The line "Advertise routes with local-label via Unicast SAFI" or "Do not advertise routes with locallabel via Unicast SAFI" is present on the command" show bgp neighbor" under the address family IPv4 Unicast to indicate that the BGP speaker permits the advertisement of routes with local label or not.

### **Bestpath Calculation**

There are no changes in the bestpath calculation process. If a path is SAFI 1 or SAFI 4 or if the path has a label or not, makes no difference in the bestpath calculation process. Hence, there is no preference between a SAFI 1 or SAFI 4 path. This is regardless if there is SAFI 1/SAFI 4 on the same BGP session or on different sessions. So, if one BGP session is SAFI 1 and 4, and a prefix is received over both address families, then the best path calculation will pick one as the best path, since all attributes are the same. If all BGP attributes are the same between the U and LU path, the path received last, becomes the best path.

If the SAFI 1 and SAFI 4 paths are received from different BGP peers, there is always a difference in the paths leading to BGP always picking the same best path from the two paths. Even if in this case all attributes are the same, the neighbor address is different. Looking at the <u>BGP Best Path</u> <u>Selection Algorithm</u>, the path from the neighbor with the lowest neighbor address (final step 13) is picked as the best path.

Use the command "show bgp <AFI> <SAFI> <prefix> bestpath-compare" to verify the reason why the best path is best.

This preference can be made by the user, by using RPL.

The U path is now the best.

There is no new command to prefer labeled paths over unlabeled paths. You can just configure the RPL either under address-family unicast or labeled-unicast under a BGP neighbor.

## Verifying the Behavior in BGP

To debug the BGP update propagation in IOS-XR, you can turn on the following debug command: *debug bgp update <BGP neighbor> in | out.* 

This will show the incoming or outgoing BGP update from or to that BGP speaker. The address family is shown as (**ip4u**) for unlabeled IPv4 uncast (AFI 1/SAFI 1) or as (**ipv4lu**) for labeled IPv4 uncast (AFI 1/SAFI 4). The equivalent occurs for IPv6.

There is a new field "labeled-unicast" that indicates that the path is learnt via SAFI 4.

## iBGP and next-hop-self – Unified MPLS

The rules from table 1 apply. With Unified MPLS or Seamless MPLS, an Area Border Router (ABR) acts as route-reflector but is also the next-hop for the iBGP routes. The ABRs are in the forwarding path of the labeled traffic. The ABRs must have the explicit configuration for next-hop-self.

## Workarounds

• If there is no support for U and LU over one BGP session, a workaround is to have two BGP sessions between a pair of routers. Two (loopback) interfaces must be used on each router.
