Command Modes	Exec > Global Configuration > User-Plane Profile Configuration	
	<pre>configure &gt; user-plane-profile profile_id</pre>	
	Entering the above command sequence results in the following prompt:

Important	The commands or keywords/variables that are available are dependent on platform type, product version, and installed license(s).	
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### do show

	Executes all show commands while in Configuration mode.
Product	All
Privilege	Security Administrator, Administrator
Syntax Description	do show
Usage Guidelines	Use this command to run all Exec mode <b>show</b> commands while in Configuration mode. It is not necessary to exit the Config mode to run a <b>show</b> command.
	The pipe character   is only available if the command is valid in the Exec mode.
Caution	There are some Exec mode <b>show</b> commands which are too resource intensive to run from Config mode. These include: <b>do show support collection</b> , <b>do show support details</b> , <b>do show support record</b> and <b>do show support summary</b> . If there is a restriction on a specific <b>show</b> command, the following error message is displayed:
	Failure: Cannot execute 'do show support' command from Config mode.

Exits the current configuration mode and returns to the Exec mode.

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# endpoint

	Use this command to configure User Plane endpoint IP address attribute.

Privilege	Security Administrator, Administrator
Command Modes	Exec > Global Configuration > User-Plane Profile Configuration
	configure > user-plane-profile <i>profile_id</i>
	Entering the above command sequence results in the following prompt:
	<pre>[local]host_name(config-user-plane-profile)#</pre>
Syntax Description	<pre>endpoint { ipv4_address   ipv6_address } no endpoint</pre>
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	If previously configured, removes the configured endpoint address.
	endpoint { <i>ipv4_address</i>   <i>ipv6_address</i> }
	Configures User Plane endpoint IPv4 or IPv6 address.
Usage Guidelines	Any change in <b>endpoint</b> { <i>ipv4_address</i>   <i>ipv6_address</i> } CLI configuration will not impact any existing PDN session. New configuration is applicable only for new incoming PDN sessions.
	Example
	The following command configures User Plane endpoint with IP address 1.1.1.1:
	endpoint 1.1.1.1

### exit

Exits the current mode and returns to the parent configuration mode.

Usage Guidelines	Use this command to return to the parent configuration mode.
