



Release Notes for Cisco Agent Desktop 7.0 (0) Service Release 2

August 31, 2006

These release notes describe the issue corrected by Cisco Agent Desktop 7.0(0) Service Release 2.

Installation

Cisco Agent Desktop 7.0(0) Service Release 2 must be installed on all CAD 7.0(0) servers and clients.

It is recommended that you apply this service release during a maintenance window because the procedure requires that the CAD services be restarted.

Before you install this service release:

- the base release of CAD 7.0(0) must be installed on server and client computers.
- you must log into the CAD servers as an administrator.

Installing the SR on CAD Servers

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| Step 1 | Download the CAD 7.0(0) service release executable file to your CAD server(s). Make a note of the location where you saved the downloaded file. |
| Step 2 | Double-click the downloaded file. |
| Step 3 | Follow the on-screen instructions. The service release begins installing and will replace files and restart services. |
| Step 4 | When the installation is finished, a window appears telling you that the installation is complete. |
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Installing the SR on CAD Clients

If automated updates are enabled in your system (see the *Cisco CAD Installation Guide* for more information), follow these steps.

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- Step 1** The next time a client application starts after the service release is installed, the user sees a prompt that an updated version of the application is available and will be installed.
 - Step 2** Follow the on-screen prompts.
 - Step 3** The service release installs, replacing files as needed. When the installation is finished, a window appears telling you that the installation is complete.
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If automated updates are not enabled in your system, follow these steps on each client computer.

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- Step 1** After the service release has been installed on the CAD servers, browse to the following address from the client computer:

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http://<Your CAD server IP address>:8088/TUP/CAD/SR.htm
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 - Step 2** Follow the instructions on the page to download and install the service release.
 - Step 3** The service release installs, replacing files as needed. When the installation is finished, a window appears telling you that the installation is complete.
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Uninstallation

Follow these steps to uninstall the service release from a CAD client computer.

To uninstall the service release, you must be logged in as an administrator.



Note

If you cancel the uninstallation process while it is running, the service release might continue to be listed in the Add/Remove Programs window, and you will not be able to remove or repair the service release or reinstall it. Contact Cisco TAC for assistance (see [“Submitting a Service Request”](#) for contact information).

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- Step 1** Choose **Start > Settings > Control Panel > Add/Remove Programs**.
 - Step 2** Select the program you want to uninstall.
 - Step 3** Click **Change/Remove**.
 During the uninstall process, a DOS window named **srRollbackRepair.exe** appears. Do not close this window.
 - Step 4** CAD Configuration Setup appears (see the [“Limitations”](#) section on page 3). Click **Cancel** to close the application.
 - Step 5** The srRollbackRepair.exe DOS window closes automatically.

- Step 6** Your computer automatically reboots. After the computer restarts, the system will be back to its base level software state.
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To uninstall the service release on a CAD server, follow these additional steps.

- Step 1** Follow Steps 1 through 6 in the above uninstallation procedure.
- Step 2** After your computer reboots, a DOS window named **ResetClientInstalls** appears. Do not close this window. This window automatically closes when the utility has finished running.
- Step 3** Launch CAD Configuration Setup by double-clicking **PostInstall.exe**, located in the ...Cisco\desktop\bin folder.
- Step 4** Advance through the windows using the forward arrow, accepting all the default values in each window, until you come to the Recording and Statistics Service Database window.
- Step 5** In the Recording and Statistics Service Database window, reenter the NT authentication password.
- Step 6** Continue to advance through the windows using the forward arrow you have displayed each window, and the Save button is enabled.
- Step 7** Click **Save** and then close CAD Configuration Setup.
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Limitations

CAD Configuration Setup launched when SR is uninstalled

Behavior: CAD Configuration Setup appears during the uninstallation of the SR as part of its rollback operations. It may appear more than once during the uninstallation.

Scope: Server and client machines

Cause: The base product does not allow for conditional suppression of launching CAD Configuration Setup in repair mode.

Effect on system: None.

Installer response: Click **Cancel** on each presented CAD Configuration Setup dialog box.

Future availability: This bug will be addressed in Enterprise 7.1, Express 4.1/4.6 and newer.

User may be prompted for original install media when uninstalling the SR

Behavior: A Windows Installer dialog box that asks the user to browse for media may appear.

Scope: Machines with Agent Desktop, Supervisor Desktop, and Desktop Administrator installed on them

Cause: Windows Installer does not preserve a repair-capable maintenance copy of the original media. Once the temporarily-cached original install media is cleaned up, repair functionality is lost. A scenario in which this might occur is if the client application is installed using the web browser's Run option rather than the Save option to access the installation file, and then the web browser's cache is cleared.

Effect on system: Files may be missing due to incomplete rollback.

Installer response: If during rollback the user is prompted to browse for media, then the rollback process is incomplete and the client software applications must be removed and reinstalled to regain pre-service release functionality. If no such prompting occurs, then the rollback was successful and no further action is required.

Future availability: This bug will be addressed in Enterprise 7.1, Express 4.1/4.6 and newer.

Resolved Caveats

The following issues have been resolved in CAD 7.0(0) SR2.

**Note**

Search results show an illustration of your product with the serial number label location highlighted. (S3 and S4 service requests are those in which your network is minimally impaired or for which you require product information.) Definitions of Service Request Severity

To ensure that all service requests are reported in a standard format, Cisco has established severity definitions.

Severity 1 (S1)—An existing network is down, or there is a critical impact to your business operations. You and Cisco will commit all necessary resources around the clock to resolve the situation.

Severity 2 (S2)—Operation of an existing network is severely degraded, or significant aspects of your business operations are negatively affected by inadequate performance of Cisco products. You and Cisco will commit full-time resources during normal business hours to resolve the situation.

Severity 3 (S3)—Operational performance of the network is impaired, while most business operations remain functional. You and Cisco will commit resources during normal business hours to restore service to satisfactory levels.

Severity 4 (S4)—You require information or assistance with Cisco product capabilities, installation, or configuration. There is little or no effect on your business operations.
