

## End-of-Sale and End-of-Life Announcement for the Cisco 3205 Wireless Mobile Interface Card for Europe (noncompliant with ETSI EN 301893 v1.3.1)

Cisco® announces the end-of-sale and end-of life dates for the Cisco 3205 Wireless Mobile Interface Card for Europe (noncompliant with ETSI EN 301893 v1.3.1). The last day to order the affected product(s) is March 1, 2008. Customers with active service contracts will continue to receive support from the Cisco Technical Assistance Center (TAC) as shown in Table 1 of the EoL bulletin. Table 1 describes the end-of-life milestones, definitions, and dates for the affected product(s). Table 2 lists the product part numbers affected by this announcement. For customers with active and paid service and support contracts, support will be available until the termination date of the contract, even if this date exceeds the Last Date of Support shown in Table 1.

Cisco announces the end-of-sale dates for the Cisco 3205 Wireless Mobile Interface Card (product IDs: C3205WMIC-K9 and C3205WMIC-TP-K9) for Europe. The Cisco 3205 WMIC supports 5.25-5.35 MHz and 5.470-5.725 MHz. European regulations mandate that all 802.11a/h products shipping into Europe on or after April 1, 2008, must be compliant with European Telecommunications Standardisation Institute specification EN 301893 v1.3.1 for Dynamic Frequency Selection. DFS is used for radar detection and avoidance in the 5 GHz band. The Cisco 3205 Wireless Mobile Interface Cards with product identification numbers C3205WMIC-K9 and C3205WMIC-TP-K9 do not support ETSI EN 301893 v1.3.1 for DFS version 1.3.1. Therefore, these versions of the Cisco 3205 Wireless Mobile Interface Card can no longer be sold in Europe effective April 1, 2008. Below is more information on end-of-life milestones and replacement products.

<b>End-of-Life Announcement Date</b>	The date the document that announces the end of sale and end of life of a product is distributed to the general public.	February 11, 2008
<b>End-of-Sale Date</b>	The last date to order the product through Cisco point-of-sale mechanisms. The product is no longer for sale after this date.	March 1, 2008
<b>Last Ship Date: HW</b>	The last-possible ship date that can be requested of Cisco and/or its contract manufacturers. Actual ship date is dependent on lead time.	March 14, 2008
<b>End of Routine Failure Analysis Date: HW</b>	The last-possible date a routine failure analysis may be performed to determine the cause of product failure or defect.	March 14, 2009
<b>End of New Service Attachment Date: HW</b>	For equipment and software that is not covered by a service-and-support contract, this is the last date to order a new service-and-support contract or add the equipment and/or software to an existing service-and-support contract.	March 14, 2009
<b>End of Service Contract Renewal Date: HW</b>	The last date to extend or renew a service contract for the product.	September 14, 2012
<b>Last Date of Support: HW</b>	The last date to receive service and support for the product. After this date, all support services for the product are unavailable, and the product becomes obsolete.	March 14, 2013
