Cisco® announces the end-of-sale and end-of life dates for the Cisco VFrame IB Server Virtualization Software. The last day to order the affected product(s) is August 7, 2008. Table 1 describes the end-of-life milestones, definitions, and dates for the affected product(s). Table 2 lists the product part numbers affected by this announcement. For customers with active and paid service and support contracts, support will be available until the termination date of the contract, even if this date exceeds the Last Date of Support shown in Table 1.

Cisco VFrame IB Server Virtualization Software is built on an InfiniBand switch fabric. Cisco VFrame Data Center which was launched in late 2007 continues its focus on Ethernet and Fibre Channel technologies. Information about this new product can be found at
