Business Challenge

The Social Services Association (SSA) in Tripoli, Lebanon is the leading provider of specialized care for the elderly and disabled in northern Lebanon. As a non-profit organization, it needed to be able to serve more customers without reducing the quality of care or losing control of costs.

One of the Association's top priorities was to automate its processes to become more efficient, have better visibility over the business, and improve patient care and safety. By becoming more efficient, SSA would be able to get more out of its budgets and free up staff to spend more time looking after patients.

SSA also wanted to improve information flow between its six different departments, which include a physiotherapy and rehabilitation center, a psychiatric ward, outpatient clinics, and care facilities for the elderly and disabled. Managers needed a clear view of the whole business to improve their decision-making. Clinical staff needed secure access to patients' records anywhere on the campus to help them deliver care more effectively.

Solution and Results

The Social Services Association connected the various campus buildings with a state-of-the-art Cisco technology platform and implemented a Cisco Unified Communications solution to support the staff, patients, and residents.
