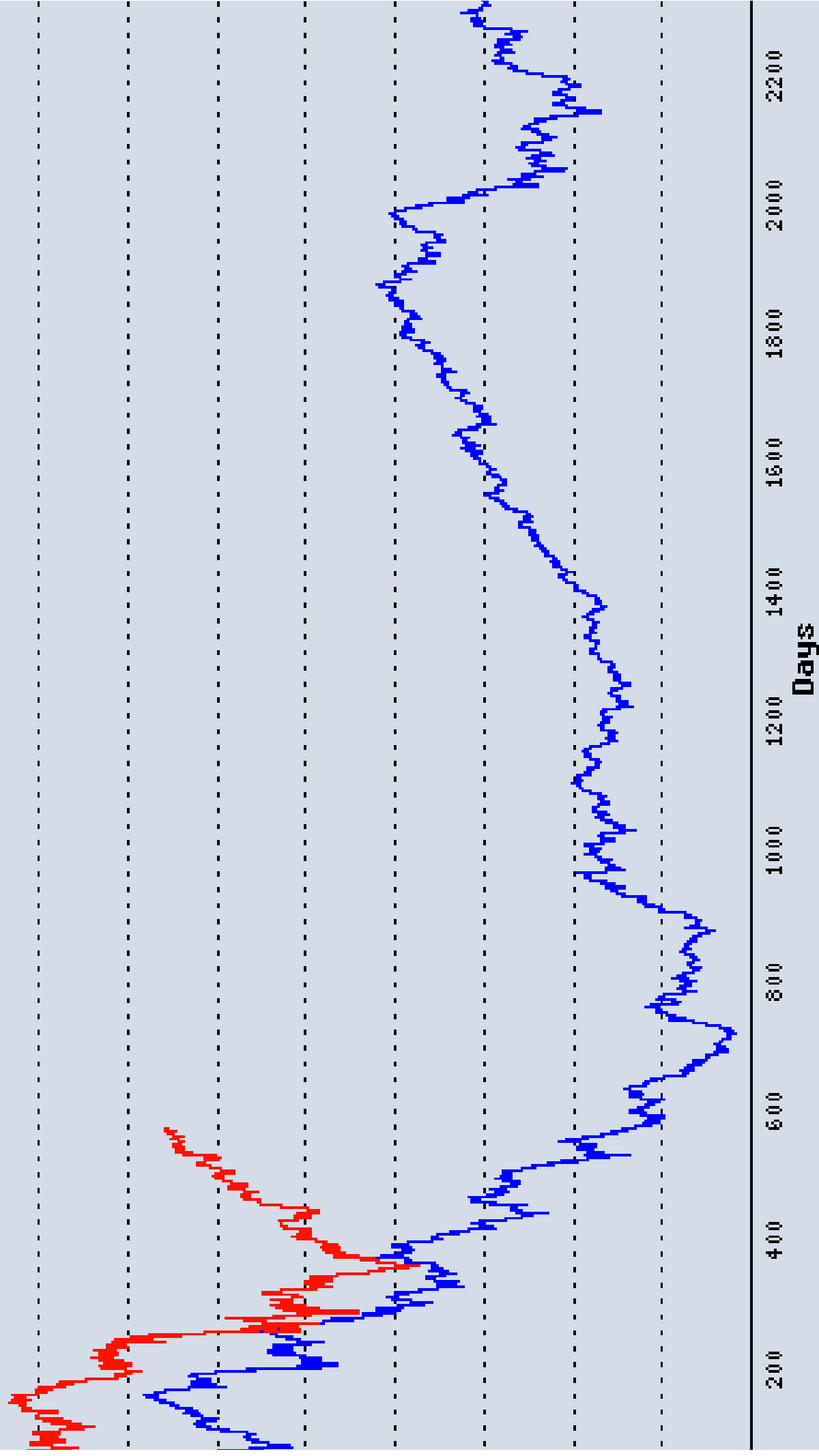


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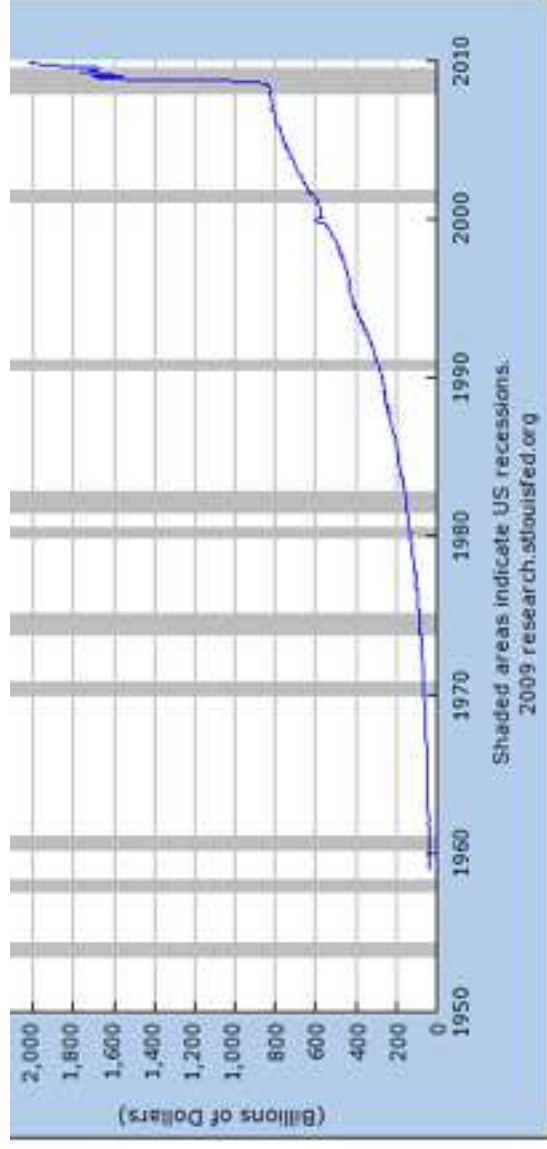

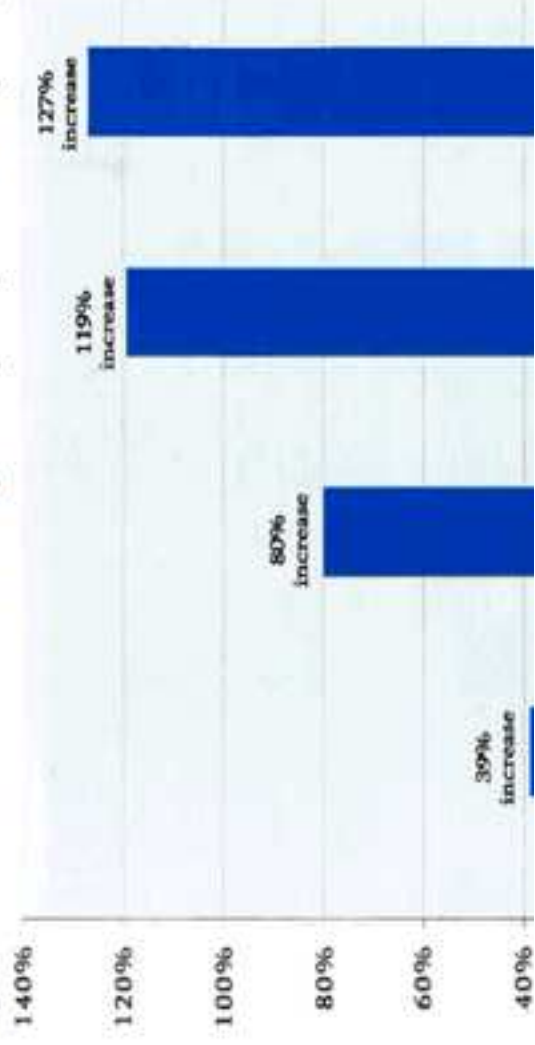

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Economic crisis 'to boost cyber crime': Microsoft

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The global financial crisis threatens to spark a rise in cyber crime as computer experts lose their jobs and resort to illegal ways to earn a living, a senior official of Microsoft said Thursday.

"Today these (cyber) attacks are not about vandalism any more, today it's about cash," said Roger Halbheer, Microsoft's chief security advisor for Europe, the Middle East and Africa.

"Cyber crime has gone from cool to cash. And this will definitely grow in the future," he told AFP on the sidelines of an international conference on terrorism and cyber security.

It is "one of the things that scares me about the economic downturn because I'm expecting cyber crime will grow."

He said the crisis had meant people with good knowledge of the industry were being laid off. "They then have time and they don't have money," he said.

Cyberspies hack into U.S. fighter project: report

WASHINGTON, Apr. 21, 2009 (Reuters) — Computer spies have repeatedly breached the Pentagon's costliest weapons program, the \$300 billion Joint Strike Fighter project, The Wall Street Journal reported on Tuesday.

The newspaper quoted current and former government officials familiar with the matter as saying the intruders were able to copy and siphon data related to design and electronics systems, making it potentially easier to defend against the plane.

The spies could not access the most sensitive material, which is kept on computers that are not connected to the Internet, the paper added.

Citing people briefed on the matter, it said the intruders entered through vulnerabilities in the networks of two or three of the contractors involved in building the fighter jet.

Lockheed Martin Corp is the lead contractor. Northrop Grumman Corp and BAE Systems PLC also have major roles in the project. Lockheed Martin and BAE

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Hackers load malware onto Mercury music award site

Security nightmare for DreamHost

Hackers have been able to load malware onto the official Mercury music awards site, as well as hundreds of other sites, into the systems of US-based hosting firm DreamHost.

DreamHost blamed a security flaw in its web control panel software for an attack that allowed hackers to compromise a subset" of user accounts. Affected customers have been notified by email. DreamHost said only web content - not credit information - was compromised.

In a [statement](#) published Wednesday, DreamHost said: "The security flaw allowed the attackers to log into our customer panel with the access privileges of another user. From our web panel they were able to access individual user passwords. The attackers also attempted to gain access to our central database and billing information but were ultimately thwarted attempt. No credit card information or customer personal information was obtained."

DreamHost takes care of more than 500,000 domains, according to the firm. An email sent by DreamHost to its customers said approximately 3,500 separate FTP accounts were compromised by the hack. DreamHost has advised its customers their FTP account passwords immediately. The firm has promised to update concerned punters about the steps it is taking a reneftition

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Official: Sarkozy's bank account hacked by thieves

PARIS, France (AP) — The French Cabinet's spokesman says "swindlers" have broken into the personal bank account of President Nicolas Sarkozy.



French President Nicolas Sarkozy reported the theft from his account last month, say media.

Spokesman Luc Chatel told France's Radio-J an investigation is under way and insists the incident "proves that this system of checking (bank accounts) via the Internet isn't infallible." He did not elaborate.

Weekly Journal du Dimanche reported Sunday that thieves seized Sarkozy's bank account information and swiped small sums of money.

The newspaper said **Sarkozy** reported the theft last month and that those responsible haven't been found. The report cited an unnamed official close to the investigation for its information.

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56 Arrested in DarkMarket Sting, Says FBI

The FBI on Friday boasted that its two-year long undercover operation against users of the crime forum DarkMarket netted 56 arrests worldwide and prevented \$70 million in economic losses, publicly acknowledging the sting for the first time.

"In today's world of rapidly expanding technology, where cybercrimes are perpetrated instantly from anywhere in the world, law enforcement needs to be flexible and creative in our efforts to target these criminals," said FBI Cyber Division Assistant Director Shawn Henry in a statement. "By joining forces with our international law enforcement counterparts, we have been, and will continue to be, successful in arresting those individuals and dismantling these forums."

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Notorious Crime Forum DarkMarket Goes Dark

A wave of bittersweet melancholy has descended on the thousands of phishers, hackers and credit card swindlers inhabiting the computer crime super-site DarkMarket.ws. On Tuesday the site's operator, known as Master Splyntr, announced that he was shuttering the forum, which has hummed along for nearly three years as a premier vehicle of criminal commerce.

"[R]ecent events have proven that even in our best efforts to expel and deactivate the accounts of suspected LE [law enforcement], reporters, and security agents, it is obvious that we haven't been entirely successful," Splyntr wrote in a message on the site.

Chief among those recent events is last week's arrest of Chao, a Turkish hacker -- and alleged kidnapper -- who served as one of DarkMarket's administrators. Chao was known for selling high-quality ATM-skimming hardware that crooks could affix to cash machines to grab debit card swipes and PINs. Turkish police arrested Chao on Friday, identifying him as one Cagatay Evyapan.

"It is apparent that this forum ... is attracting too much attention from a lot of the world services (agents of FBI, SS, and Interpol)," wrote Splyntr. "I guess it was only time before this would happen. It is very unfortunate that we have come to this situation, because ... we have established DM as the premier English speaking forum for conducting business. Such is life. When you are on top, people try to bring you down."

DarkMarket is the only survivor among the handful of crime forums that emerged to fill the hole left by the Secret Service's "Operation Firewall" in October 2004. In that unprecedented law enforcement crackdown, the agency used an informant to target what was then the top crime site, Shadowcrew.com. Twenty-eight fraudsters were arrested in coordinated raids, and Shadowcrew was shuttered.

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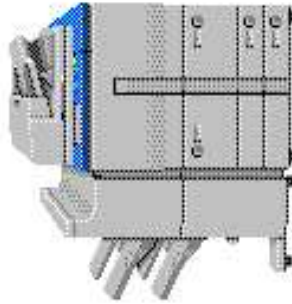

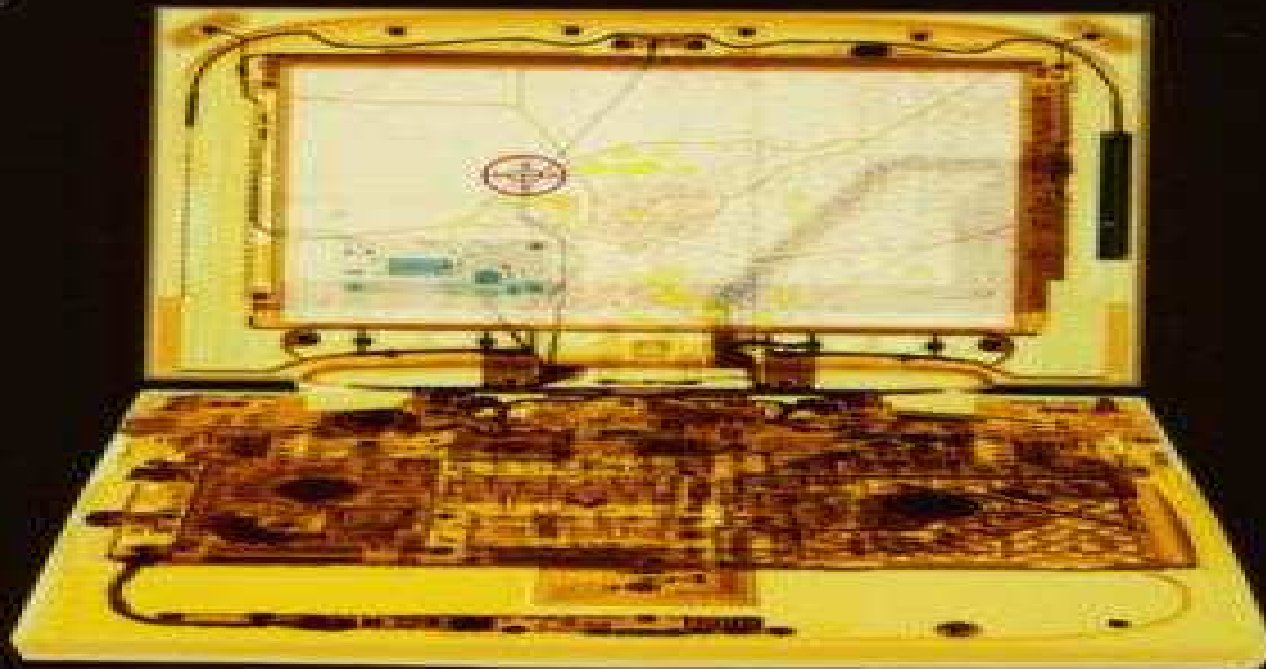

As the first particles began circulating in the [Large Hadron Collider](#) (LHC) this week, a group of hackers calling themselves the "Greek Security Team" penetrated computer systems inside [CERN's Geneva, Switzerland, facility](#), where the world's biggest particle accelerator is housed, the [Telegraph.co.uk](#) reported today.

The hackers were reportedly targeting the Compact Muon Solenoid Experiment (CMS), a device in Cessy, France, built to [monitor a wide range of particles and phenomena](#) produced in high-energy collisions in the LHC. The 12,500-ton detector's different layers (weighing, according to CERN, as much as 30 jumbo jets or 2,500 African elephants) stop and measure the different particles, and use this data to form a picture of events at the heart of the collision.
