This release note supports Local Craft Interface (LCI) Release 2.4.15. This release updates the executable program as well as the devtype collection.

Purpose

This release note is being provided for user support related to the installation and operation of LCI Release 2.4.15.

System Requirements

LCI Release 2.4.15 has the following minimum system requirements:

- Windows PC running Windows XP, Windows 7, or Windows 10
- At least 15 megabytes free disk space
- RS-232 port

Limitations, Restrictions, and Caveats

If possible, use a true RS-232 PC port with LCI. When using a USB to RS-232 converter cable or box, be aware that some of these devices work better than others. If you experience trouble when using such a converter, try using a different brand device.

To Install the LCI Software

LCI is distributed as a zipped executable file (.zip) that can be downloaded from www.cisco.com.

Complete the following steps to install the LCI software:

- 1 Download the LCI installation file from www.cisco.com.
- **2** Unzip the installation file to your Windows desktop.
- 3 Double-click the unzipped (.exe) file to open the installer application.
- **4** Follow the steps of the installer to complete the installation.

Note: We recommend that you check the Cisco website periodically for updates to the LCI program as well as for new or revised devtype files.
