### Behavior Changes for this Release

The following behavior changes are visible in this ER release.

### 3GPP Spec Version Compliance Configuration for CHF Server—CSCwe29701

**Previous Behavior**: CHF used to reject the charging data request from SMF due to the invalid format of subscriberIdentifier included in the request.

**New Behavior**: 3GPP TS 32.291 specification introduces a new subscriberIdentifier type in 15.4.0 release. The compliance profile configuration for nchf-convergedcharging service now supports the 15.4.0 spec version. That means, the CHF server is configured to use 15.4.0 3GPP spec compliance version to avoid rejection of charging data request.
