Versioning: Format & Field Description

Where, YYYY \rightarrow 4 Digit year. TTN \rightarrow Throttle of Throttle Number. Optional Field, Starts with 1. Precedes with "t" which represents the word Mandatory Field Starts with 2020. Incremented after the last planned release of year. "throttle of throttle" Applicable only in "Throttle of Throttle" cases. Reset to 1 at the beginning of every major release RN → Major Release Number. for that release Mandatory Field Starts with 1. . $\text{DN} \rightarrow \text{DEV}$ branch Number. Support preceding 0. The appropriate version number field increments after a version has been released. The new version numbering format is a contiguous sequential number that represents incremental changes between releases. This format facilitates identifying the changes between releases when using Bug Search Tool to research software releases.
