Alan Balutis is a director in the Cisco Internet Business Solutions Group (IBSG). IBSG works with many of the world's leading companies and governments to help them become more effective through changed business processes and intelligent technology deployment.

Balutis came to Cisco after 30 years of work in government, academia, and both the private and nonprofit sectors. He held senior management and policy positions in government, serving as head of the management and budget office at the Department of Commerce for more than a decade as well as being appointed as its first chief information officer. A founding member of the Federal CIO Council (CIOC), Balutis chaired its Strategic Planning and Outreach committees, created the CIOC's E-Government Committee, and served as its first chair. He led a number of government-wide studies for the President's Council on Management Improvement, the Cabinet Council on Management and Administration, and the National Performance Review.

Balutis is a Fellow in the National Academy of Public Administration and is a member of both the *Federal Computer Week* and *Government Computer News* Information Technology Halls of Fame. After leaving government, he served as executive director of the Industry Advisory Council, a major IT trade association, as well as its parent group, the American Council of Technology. Balutis also served as president of Veridyne and INPUT, both winners of Fast 50 recognition for their growth under his leadership. He has authored four books, along with numerous articles and conference papers.
