Introduction to Cisco License On-Prem

Cisco License On-Prem is an IT Asset Management solution that enables customers to administer Cisco products and licenses on their premises. It is designed as an extension of Cisco Smart Software Manager and provides a similar set of features.



Business Problem

- **Local control & compliance** for strict security and regulatory needs
- **Air-gapped environments** with limited or no connection to Cisco's central licensing database



Solution

- **Local licensing system** hosted on customer's network
- **Licenses managed offline**, keeping sensitive data in-house
- **No constant cloud connection**, ensuring regulatory and security compliance

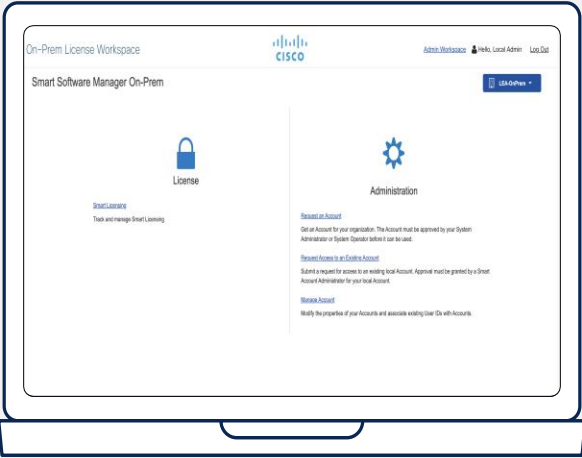


Outcomes

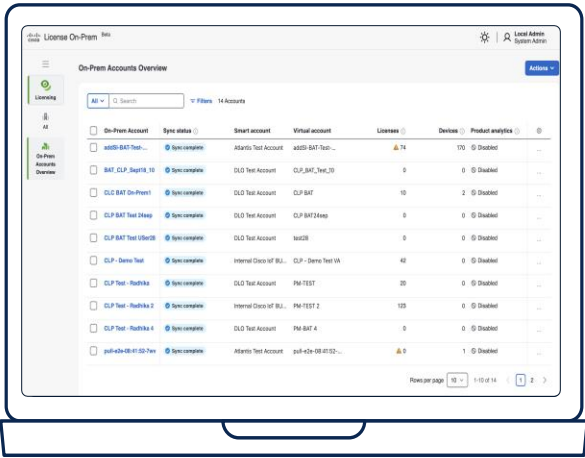
- **Eliminates external dependency**, minimizing compliance risks

Cisco License On-Prem Features

High Availability & Performance

Support for Two and Three-node HA architecture ensures improved performance, failover, and uninterrupted service.

Flexible Deployment

Supports multiple platforms including VMware ESXi, AWS, Azure, Hyper-V, Nutanix, KVM-Ubuntu and RHEL and OpenShift Virtualization for versatile virtual environment deployment. Includes AMD support for CLP.

User Experience & Efficiency

Features a user-centric design with a modern UX framework, contributing to reduced operational expenses. Embedded AI Assistant.

Stability & Security

Includes rate limiting, FIPS certification, and secure Okta-based authentication.

Multi-Tenancy and Scalability

Allows for the management of multiple Cisco Virtual Accounts or customer Smart accounts. Scales up to a total 300,000* product instances with a maximum capacity of 25,000 Product Instances per account using 1 license each.

Cloud Consistency & Integration

Offers a consistent experience with the Cisco Cloud UI, providing improved visibility and actionable insights.

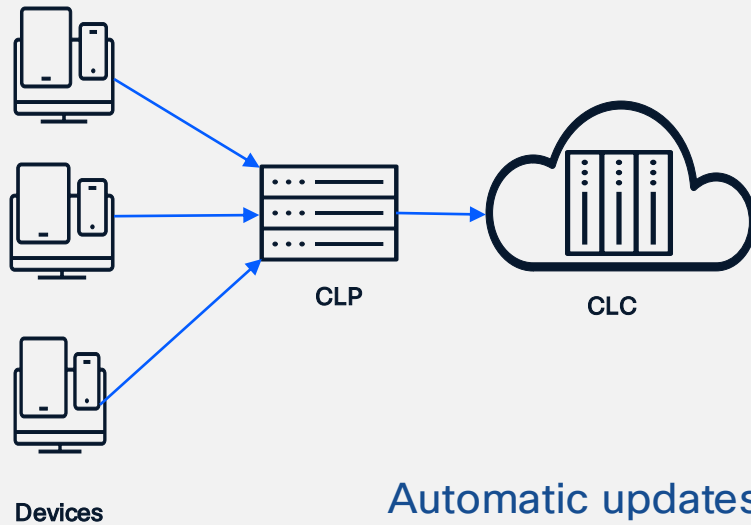

Connectivity Modes

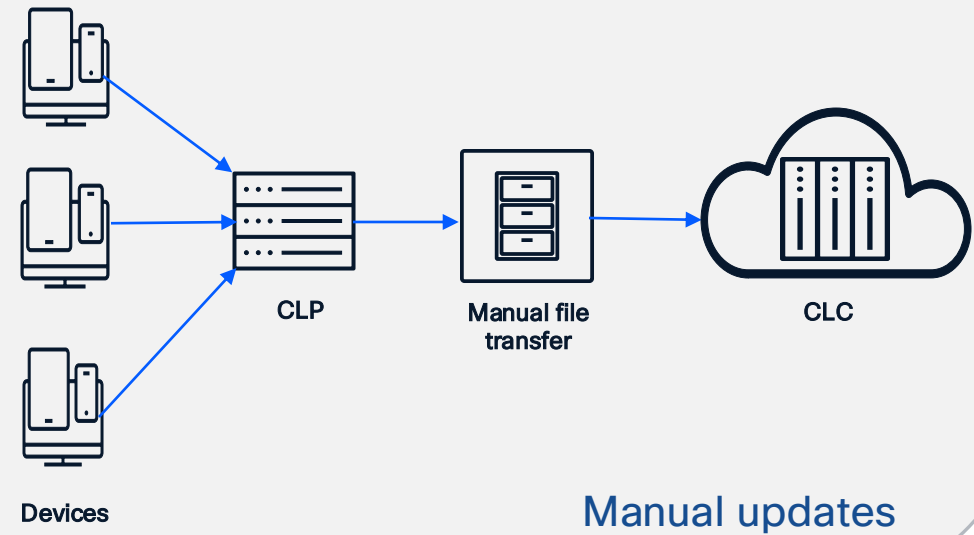
Connected

- Mode is used when there is **direct connectivity** to Cisco License Central from the Cisco License On-Prem.
- License consumption and entitlements can be synchronized with Cisco Licenses Central on-demand or automatically via scheduling
- Standard model & easiest to deploy.



Disconnected

- Mode is used when there is **no connectivity** to Cisco License Central from the Cisco License On-Prem.
- Cisco License On-Prem can be synchronized with Cisco License Central via a file upload and download.

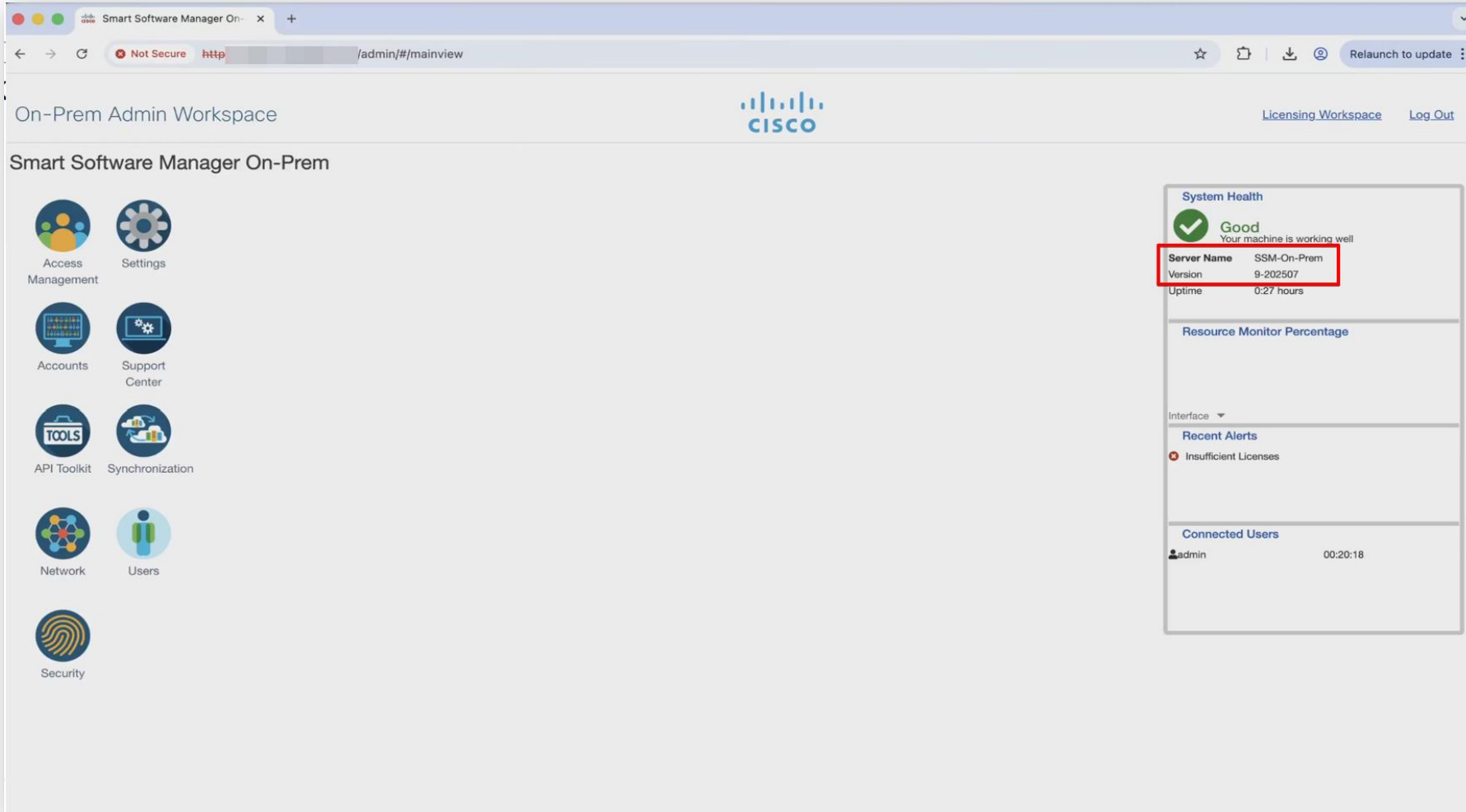
General pre-upgrade steps:

1. Confirm the upgrade path is supported for your exact current and target releases
2. Verify the virtual machine meets the minimum requirements for the target release
3. Do not resize the virtual machine during the upgrade process
4. Perform a full database backup and take a snapshot (if possible) and complete synchronization before starting the upgrade to prevent potential data loss.
5. If using proxy – enable the new endpoint for outgoing traffic: **id.cisco.com**
6. Please refer to Upgrade procedure in [Release notes](#) and [Installation guide](#)

Post-upgrade checks:

1. Clear your browser cache after the process is complete to ensure the interface correctly displays the updated environment.
2. Confirm the new version from CLI
3. Log in to the web UI and confirm it is accessible
4. **Sync Status shows as sync required for all the accounts, perform the synchronization.**
5. Confirm product instances and license usage appear as expected
6. If applicable, verify: proxy connectivity, certificate status, cluster / HA health
7. Keep the VM snapshot until functionality is validated
8. **In case of any upgrade failures, please do not rollback to previous SSM On-Prem version. Please raise a case with Cisco TAC.**

Pre-Upgrade System Setup



Pre-Checks

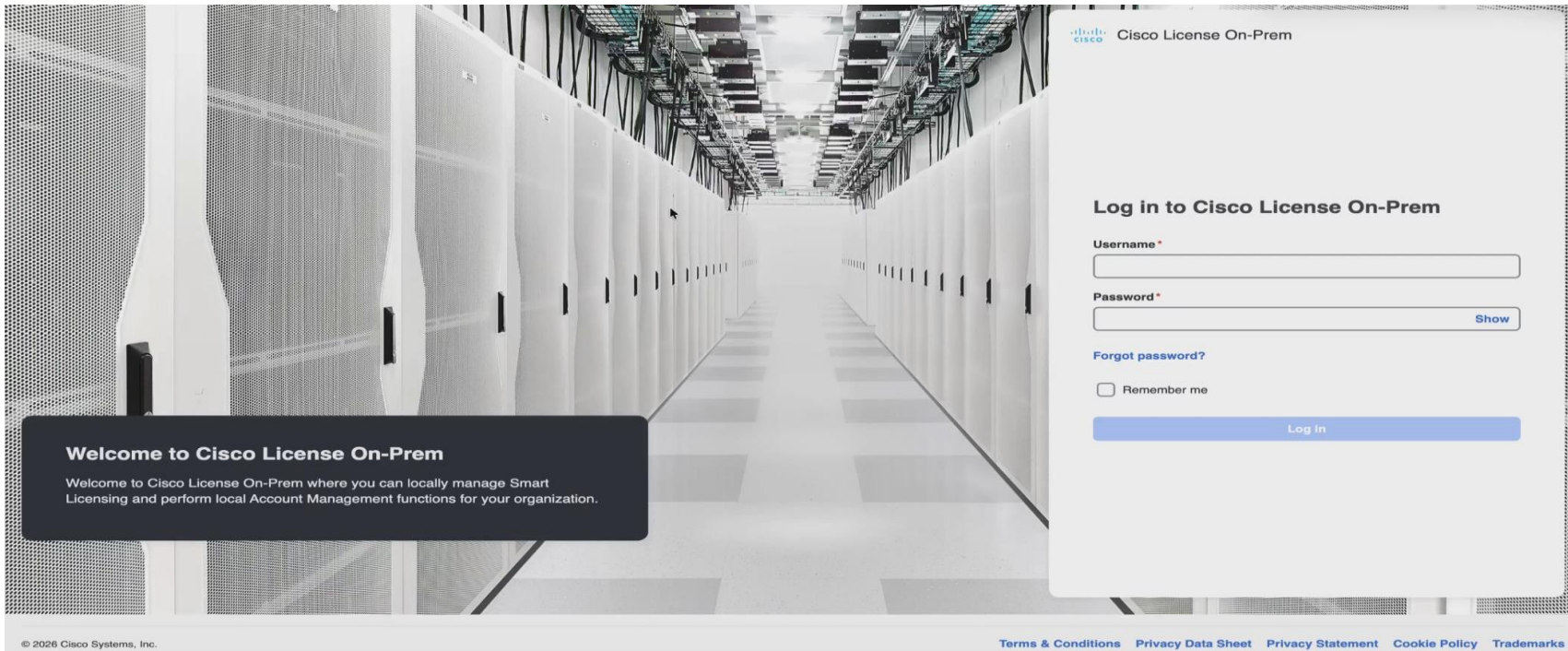
1. Confirm the integrity of all existing accounts, device configurations, and LDAP settings.
2. Ensure automated database backups are current, and security certificates are valid.
3. Establish this baseline to guarantee a stable starting point before initiating the upgrade.

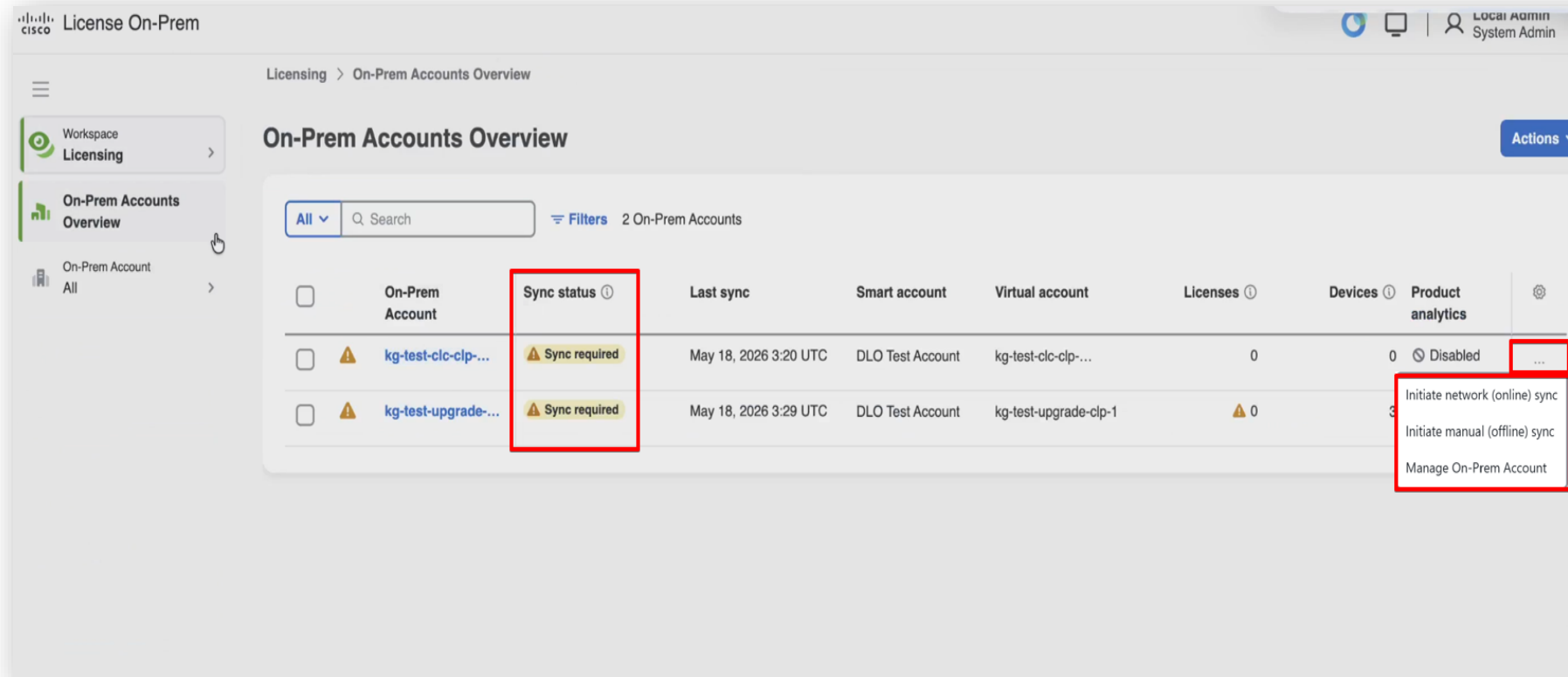

Process

1. The user logs into the On-Prem console and uploads the upgrade patch file.
2. Required commands are executed to initiate the upgrade process.
3. The system is successfully upgraded to the latest Cisco License On-Prem version.

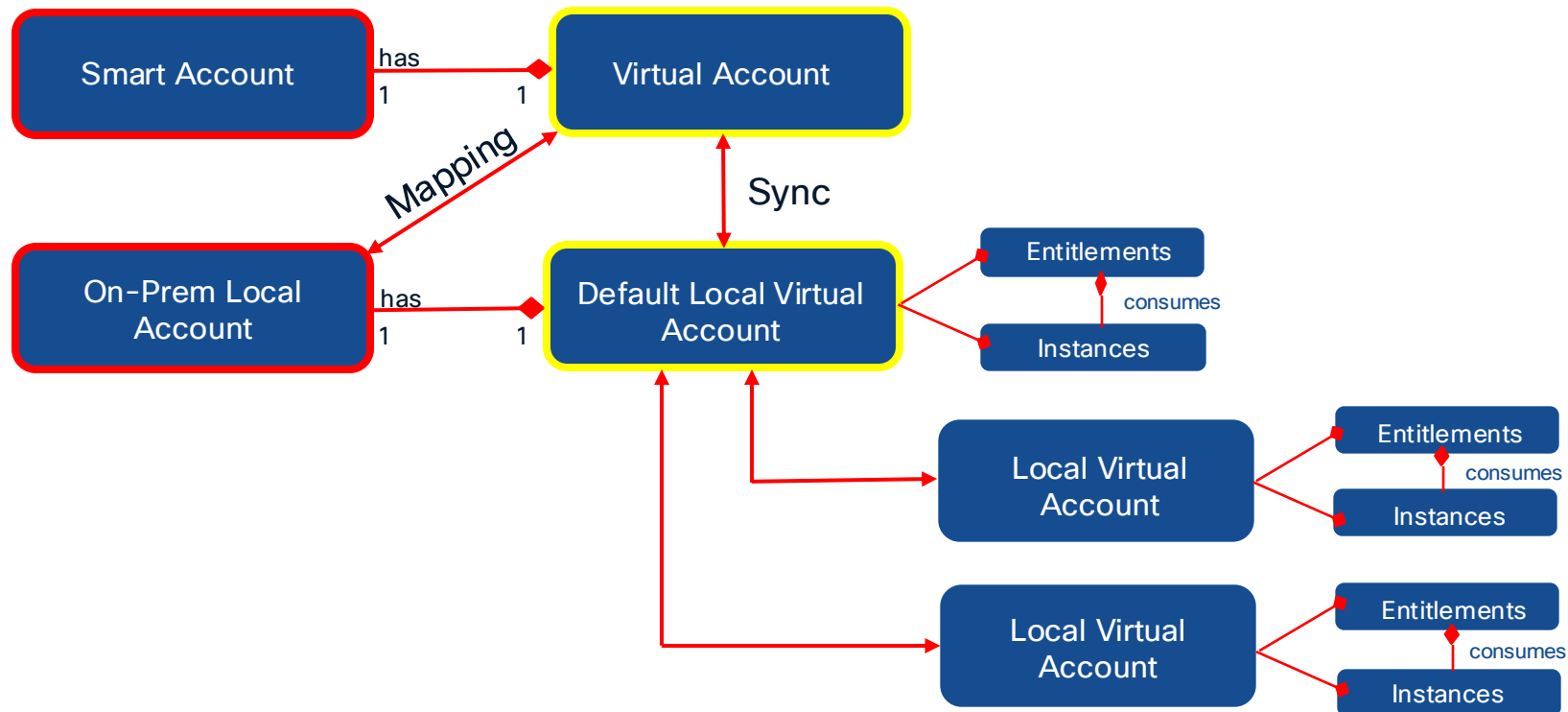
Workflow

1. After the upgrade, on-premises accounts must be synchronized for the first time.
2. Initial synchronization ensures all existing accounts are aligned with the updated system.
3. This step sets up a consistent baseline for ongoing account management and integration.

Cisco License On-Prem UI walkthrough

Mapping Smart Account with On-Prem

- Cisco uses **Smart Accounts** and **Virtual Accounts**, while On-Prem uses **Local Accounts** and **Local Virtual Accounts**.
- Each **On-Prem Local Account** maps to one **Cisco Virtual Account** (one-to-one relationship).
- A **Local Account** can contain **multiple Local Virtual Accounts**.
- Each **Local Virtual Account** can hold multiple registered product instances and their associated licenses.
- One Local Virtual Account is always the **Default** and is named “**Default**”.
