

## End-of-Sale and End-of-Life Announcement for the Cisco NX-OS Software Releases 4.0 and 4.1 for the Cisco Nexus 7000 Series Switches

Cisco announces the end-of-sale and end-of life dates for the Cisco NX-OS Software Releases 4.0 and 4.1 for the Cisco Nexus 7000 Series Switches. The last day to order the affected product(s) is November 29, 2010. Customers with active service contracts will continue to receive support from the Cisco Technical Assistance Center (TAC) as shown in Table 1 of the EoL bulletin. Table 1 describes the end-of-life milestones, definitions, and dates for the affected product(s). Table 2 lists the product part numbers affected by this announcement. For customers with active and paid service and support contracts, support will be available until the termination date of the contract, even if this date exceeds the Last Date of Support shown in Table 1.

<b>Last Ship Date: OS SW</b>	The last-possible ship date that can be requested of Cisco and/or its contract manufacturers. Actual ship date is dependent on lead time.	November 29, 2010
<b>End of SW Maintenance Releases Date: OS SW</b>	The last date that Cisco Engineering may release any final software maintenance releases or bug fixes. After this date, Cisco Engineering will no longer develop, repair, maintain, or test the product software.	November 29, 2011
<b>Last Date of Support:</b>	The last date to receive service and support for the product. After this date, all support services for the product are unavailable, and the product becomes obsolete.	November 30, 2015
