Day Zero Configuration Via Web or Via App

Objective

The objective of this document is to show you how to configure the day zero setup of a Cisco Business Wireless (CBW) Access Point (AP) using the Setup Wizard on your PC running Windows 10.

CBW APs are administered through a web user interface. To use this interface, your browser must be one of the following:

- Microsoft Internet Explorer 10 or above
- Apple Safari version 7 or above
- Mozilla Firefox version 33 or above
- Google Chrome version 38 or above

Requirements

- A DHCP Server is required for the day zero setup.
- Only ONE CBW deployment per LAN is feasible. If you need more than one deployment, it is required to isolate the networks.
- All primary-capable APs must be on the same VLAN.

If you are looking to set up your Cisco Business wireless device, you have come to the right place! The day zero configuration will guide you through setting up your new, out of the box CBW AP. The CBW APs are 802.11 a/b/g/n/ac (Wave 2) based, with internal antennas. These access points support the latest 802.11ac Wave 2 standard for higher performance, greater access, and higher-density networks. They deliver industry-leading performance with highly secure and reliable wireless connections, for a robust, mobile end-user experience.

These APs can be used as traditional standalone devices or as part of a mesh


Log into the Web User Interface (UI) of the Primary AP. To do this, open a web browser and enter https://ciscobusiness.cisco. You may receive a warning before proceeding. Enter your credentials. You can also access the Primary AP by entering https://

Step 1

To get started, power up the access point. Check the status of the indicator lights. The access point will take about 8 - 10 minutes to boot. The LED will blink green in multiple patterns, alternating rapidly through green, red, and amber before turning green again. There may be small variations in the LED color intensity and hue from unit to unit. When the LED light is blinking green, proceed to the next step.

The PoE Ethernet Uplink Port on the Primary AP can ONLY be used to provide uplink to the LAN, and NOT to connect to any other primary-capable or mesh extender devices.

Step 2

On your PC, click the Wi-Fi icon and choose CiscoBusiness-Setup wireless network. Click Connect.




If your access point isn't new, out of the box, make sure it is reset to factory default settings for the CiscoBusiness-Setup SSID to show up in your Wi-Fi options.

Step 3

Enter the passphrase cisco123 and click Next.



You will get the following screen. As you can configure only one device at a time, Click **No.**



Only one device can be connected to the *CiscoBusiness-Setup* ssid. If a second device attempts to connect, it will not be able to. If you are unable to connect to the SSID and have validated the password, some other device may have made the connection. Restart the AP and try again.

Step 5

Once connected, the web browser should auto-redirect to the CBW AP setup wizard. If not, open a web browser, such as Internet Explorer, Firefox, Chrome or Safari. In the address bar, type http://ciscobusiness.cisco and press Enter. Click Start on the webpage.




If you do not see the webpage, wait for a few more minutes or reload the page. After this initial setup, you will use https://ciscobusiness.cisco to log in. If your web browser autopopulates with http://, you need to manually type in the https:// to gain access.

Step 6


Create an admin account by entering the following:

- Admin username (Maximum of 24 characters)
- Admin password
- · Confirm admin password

You can choose to show the password by checking the checkbox next to *Show Password*. Click **Start**.



Do not use "cisco" or variations of it in the username or password fields. If you do, you will get an error message as shown below.




Step 7

Set Up Your Primary AP by entering the following:

- Primary AP Name
- Country
- Date & Time
- Timezone
- (Optional) Mesh

Click Next.




Mesh should be enabled only if you plan to create a mesh network. By default, it is disabled.

Step 8

Create Your Wireless Networks by entering the following:

- Network Name
- Choose Security
- Passphrase
- Confirm Passphrase
- (Optional) Check the checkbox to Show Passphrase.

Click Next.



Wi-Fi protected Access (WPA) version 2 (WPA2), is the current standard for Wi-Fi security.

Step 9

Confirm the settings and click Apply.






Step 10

Click **OK** to apply the settings.

Primary AP will reboot after these configurations are applied. Click Ok to continue or click Cancel to return to the set up wizard.



You will see the following screen while the configurations are being saved and the system reboots. This might take 5 - 6 minutes.



pattern, it indicates that there is no DHCP server in your network. Make sure a DHCP server is present to provide IP addresses for CBW devices during the initial installation process. Ensure that the AP is connected to a switch or a router with a DHCP server.

Step 11

Go to the wireless options on your PC and choose the network that you configured. Click **Connect**.

In this example, the network is **CBWWlan**. The CiscoBusiness-Setup SSID will disappear after reboot.



Step 12

Open a web-browser and type in *https:://[IP address* of the CBW AP]. Alternatively you can type *https://ciscobusiness.cisco* in the address bar and press enter. Ensure that you type https and not http at this step.



If you are using a wired connection after the initial setup, make sure to use https:://[IP

address of the CBW AP] and not https://ciscobusiness.cisco. The latter will only work in a wireless setting.


Step 13

Click Login.




Step 14

Log in using the credentials that were configured. Click **OK**.



You will be able to access the web-configuration page of the AP.



If you have any issues, check out the following tips:

- Make sure the correct Service Set Identifier (SSID) is selected. This is the name that you
 created for the wireless network.
- Disconnect any VPN for either the mobile app or on a laptop. You might even be connected to a VPN that your mobile service provider uses that you might not even know. For example, an Android (Pixel 3) phone with Google Fi as a service provider there is a built-in VPN that auto-connects without notification. This would need to be disabled to find the Primary AP.
- Log into the Primary AP with https://<IP address of the Primary AP>.
- Once you do initial setup, be sure https://is being used whether you are logging into ciscobusiness.cisco or by entering the IP address into your web browser. Depending on your settings, your computer may have auto-populated with https://since that is what you used the very first time you logged in.
- To help with problems related to accessing the web UI or browser issues during the use of the AP, in the web browser (Firefox in this case) click on Open menu, go to Help > Troubleshooting Information and click on Refresh Firefox.

A new Cisco Business wireless implementation using the Mobile App

Step 1

To get started, power up the Access Point. The access point will take about 8 - 10 minutes to boot. The LED will blink green in multiple patterns, alternating rapidly through green, red, and amber before turning green again. There may be small

variations in the LED color intensity and hue from unit to unit. Check the status of the indicator lights. When the LED light is blinking green, proceed to the next step.

The PoE Ethernet Uplink Port on the Primary AP can ONLY be used to provide uplink to the LAN, and NOT to connect to any other primary-capable or mesh extender devices.

Step 2

Connect to the **CiscoBusiness-Setup** wireless network on your mobile device. The password is **cisco123**. Click **Join**.







If your access point isn't new, out of the box, make sure it is reset to factory default settings for the CiscoBusiness-Setup SSID to show up in your Wi-Fi options.

Step 3

Download the Cisco Business Wireless app available on Google Play or the App Store on your mobile.

Step 4

Open the Cisco Business Application on your mobile device.




Step 5

The App automatically detects the mobile network. Select **Set up My Network**.



If you would like to enable mesh, slide the option to select Mesh. Click Next.



Configure the *Wireless Network* by entering the following:

- Network name/SSID
- Security
- Passphrase
- Confirm Passphrase
- (Optional) Check Show Passphrase





Step 10

To confirm settings on the Submit to Primary AP screen, click Submit.



Wait for the reboot to complete.



The reboot can take about 8 - 10 minutes. During reboot, the LED in the access point will go through multiple color patterns. When the LED is blinking green, proceed to the next step. If the LED does not get past red flashing pattern, it indicates that there is no DHCP server in your network. Make sure a DHCP server is present to provide IP addresses for CBW devices during the initial installation process. Ensure that the AP is connected to a switch or a router with a DHCP server.

Step 11

You will see the following *Confirmation* screen. Click **OK**.

Confirmation

The Primary AP has been fully configured and will restart in 6 minutes. After the Primary AP is restarted, it will be accessible from the network by going to this URL - https://ciscobusiness.cisco via browser or using Discovered Primary list in Cisco Business Mobile Application provided client should be connected to configured ' TestAP ' SSID.



Ensure to close the App and relaunch it to successfully complete the day zero set up and to start managing your network.

If you have any issues, check out the following tips:

- Make sure the correct Service Set Identifier (SSID) is selected. This is the name that you
 created for the wireless network.
- Disconnect any VPN for either the mobile app or on a laptop. You might even be connected to a VPN that your mobile service provider uses that you might not even know. For example, an Android (Pixel 3) phone with Google Fi as a service provider there is a built-in VPN that auto-connects without notification. This would need to be disabled to find the Primary AP.
- If you have an Android phone, you may be using a private Domain Name Server (DNS)
 and may need to disable this feature for connectivity. To check this, you can typically
 find this under Settings > Network and Internet > Advanced > Private DNS.
- Log into the Primary AP with https://<IP address of the Primary AP>.
- Once you do initial setup, be sure https://is being used whether you are logging into
 ciscobusiness.cisco or by entering the IP address into your web browser. Depending on
 your settings, your computer may have auto-populated with http://since that is what you
 used the very first time you logged in.
- To help with problems related to accessing the web UI or browser issues during the use of the AP, in the web browser (Firefox in this case) click on Open menu, go to Help > Troubleshooting Information and click on Refresh Firefox.
