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Firewall Migration Manager, Release 10.0.0

Firewall Migration Manager is a network security application with functionality that supports firewall infrastructure transitions, including configuration parsing, feature mapping, policy deployment, and validation. The application includes automated workflows, intelligent rule optimization, and a unified wizard-driven interface to help ensure accuracy, efficiency, and consistency in your network security modernization efforts.

This document provides information about features, release-specific details, limitations, and guidelines for the Firewall Migration Manager, Release 10.0.0.

Base functionality	Auto-detection of target versions	Automatically identifies target device version and information for Secure Firewall Management Center and Secure Firewall Threat Defense to ensure accurate configuration alignment.
	Automated migration workflow	The Firewall Migration Manager reduces manual effort with automated transition of security policies, network objects, and device configurations from your existing environment to Secure Firewall Threat Defense.
	Centralized dashboard support	The Firewall Migration Manager dashboard provides a unified, intuitive interface to streamline your migration journey. Designed to improve visibility and operational efficiency, the dashboard offers the following capabilities: • Migration overview: Monitor the status of all your migration projects in real-time and include counts for completed, in-progress, and error-state migrations. • Proactive alerting: Stay informed with immediate visibility into recent migration alerts and project details. • Quick links: Access critical resources directly from the dashboard, including pre-migration checklists, comprehensive video guides, and one-click support ticket creation. This centralized approach simplifies the transition from third-party or legacy firewalls to next-generation Cisco firewall platforms, ensuring a more organized and manageable migration process.
	Improved GUI	The Firewall Migration Manager offers an improved graphical user interface that unifies migration tasks in a wizard-driven orchestration platform. Prioritizes visual clarity, parallel task processing, and proactive status monitoring.

	Intelligent parsing	This feature automatically scans your configurations to identify items that are either unsupported or unreferenced. This helps you save time by focusing your manual cleanup efforts only on the items that require attention. Parses enterprise-scale configurations efficiently, handling thousands of rules in minutes.
	Migration history retention	Keeps migration history across different projects so you can track and revisit previous migrations.
	Parallel migration support	To improve efficiency, this feature allows you to run up to 10 migration processes simultaneously, enabling bulk handling of your network transitions.
	Pause and resume	The Firewall Migration Manager allows tasks to be paused and resumed at any point without data loss. In-Progress can be accessed from the Recent Alerts tile on the home page or by clicking Migration under the main menu.

System requirements

These system requirements must be met to use the Firewall Migration Manager and to deploy features successfully to the target Firewall Management Center:

- **Operating System:** Microsoft Windows 10 (64-bit) or macOS (version 10.13 or higher).
- **Browser:** Google Chrome (must be set as the system default).
- **Licensing:** The Firewall Migration Manager application is free. However, the target Firewall Management Center must be properly licensed for the Firewall Threat Defense features you intend to deploy.
- **Connectivity:** IP network connectivity is required to extract configurations (Live Connect) or to push policies to the Cloud-hosted Management Center.

Supported ASA and Firewall Threat Defense platforms

To avoid compatibility or deployment issues, ensure that you use only the supported ASA and Firewall Threat Defense platforms for Firewall Migration Manager migration. For more information, see [Supported ASA and Threat Defense platforms](#).

Migration limitations

The following considerations apply when migrating from ASA to Firewall Threat Defense devices using Firewall Migration Manager:

- **Manual Tasks:** Certain configurations, such as ASA trustpoint or certificate migration and specific AnyConnect profile uploads, must be performed manually as part of pre-migration activities.
- **Unsupported Configurations:** Some configurations, such as user-based access control, specific NAT configurations, or transport mode IPsec, are not supported. These must be configured manually on the Firewall Threat Defense device after migration. Refer to [Supported configuration elements for migration](#) for supported configuration.
- **Device Pre-staging:** For native Firewall Threat Defense devices, make sure your target device has at least as many physical or port channel interfaces as the source ASA before you start the migration.
