

Release Notes for Cisco D9865 Satellite Receiver Version 2.80

Overview

This document describes the new features, resolved caveats, and open caveats in Version 2.80 for the Cisco D9865 Satellite Receiver.

New Features

The following is a list of new features for Version 2.80:

- Allows Closed Captions output on VBI line 18 when the D9865 is configured to convert NTSC frame rate input video containing Closed Captions data to PAL-N video format. The Normal Line 21 Closed Captions output for NTSC video formats, with input NTSC video, is not affected.



Note Closed Captions is available only in the CVBS video output regardless of video format.

- Reduced the duration of the Video Format Mismatch blue alert screen that appears in the video output when the D9865 first detects that incoming video frame rate and outgoing video frame rate are configured differently.

Bug ID	Description
CSCvd41063	In non-standards compliant streams, PAT does not identify the NIT PID.
CSCvf78721	Small MPE frames are dropped.
