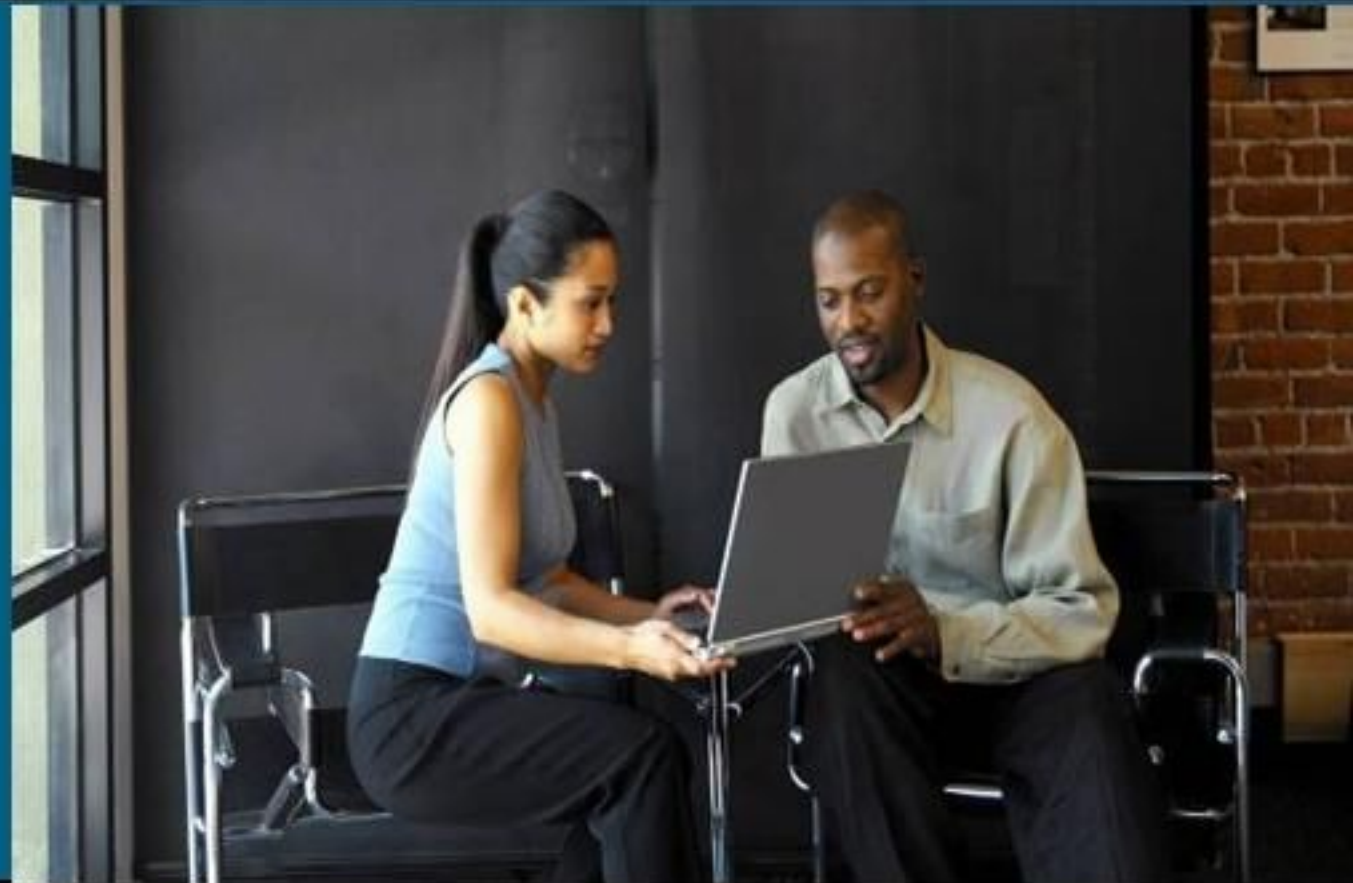

Microsoft Office Communicator MOC

- This is the key client interface for MSFT
- Think of it as a soft phone with presence and IM
- MOC is a new part of Office 2007
- It is not guaranteed all customers will have it as there are different levels of Office 2007

Microsoft Live Meeting & Round Table

- Live Meeting offers a conferencing and collaboration application
- Round Table provide a basic VC capability

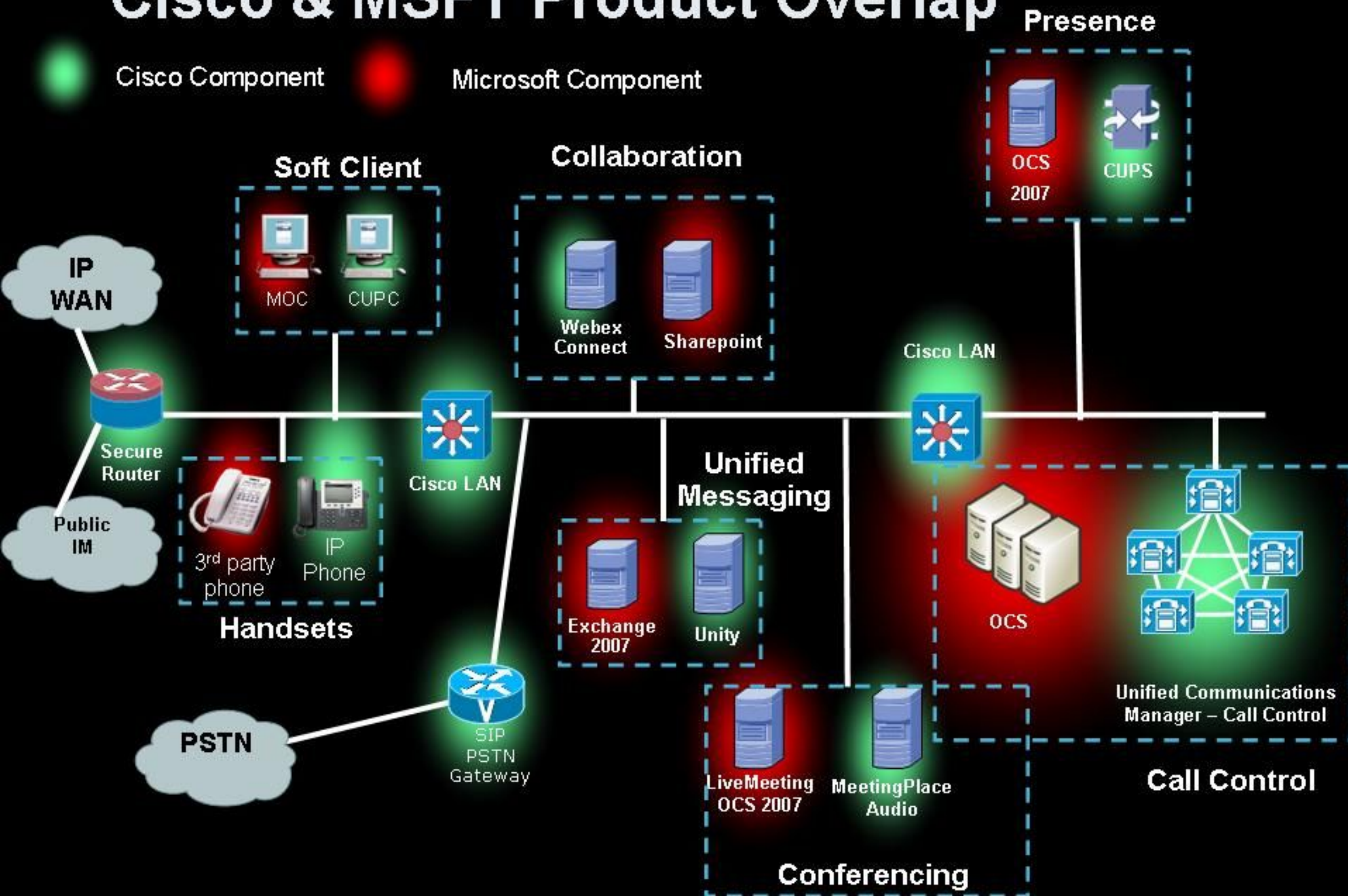
Key Capabilities & Target

- Organize team collaboration around documents, tasks, lists, wikis and blogs using Office 2007
- Provide social networking tools that allow end users to create and manage a personal profile
- Integrates with other enterprise applications through search, forms, and portlets to unify access to critical enterprise data
- Sold to enterprises as an enterprise content management solution with tight integration with Office suite and Outlook client.
- Ties in heavily with other Microsoft Server products, including Exchange, Office Communication Server and SQL Server.

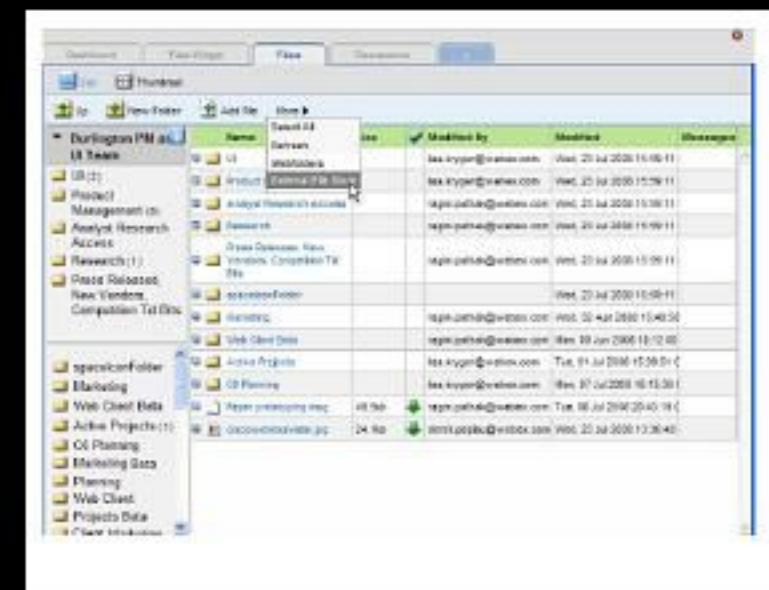
